## Definitions of "Rocky" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "rocky" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Difficult and full of problems.
- Relating to or characteristic of rock music.
- Liable to rock.
- Abounding in rocks or stones.
- Full of hardship or trials.
- Tending to rock or shake; unsteady.
- Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements.
- Consisting or full of rock or rocks.

bouldered	Abounding in rocks or stones.
bouldery	Abounding in rocks or stones. <i>Bouldery</i> beaches.
<u>bumpy</u>	(of a journey or other movement) involving sudden jolts and jerks. <i>The car jolted on the <b>bumpy</b> road.</i>
difficult	Hard to control. She had a <b>difficult</b> decision to make.
flimsy	(of a pretext or account) weak and unconvincing. A <b>flimsy</b> barrier.
hard	Unfortunate or hard to bear. <i>Hard</i> liquor.
jolting	Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements.
jolty	Causing or characterized by jolts and irregular movements.
jumpy	Being in a tense state. <i>He was tired and <b>jumpy</b>.</i>
pebbly	Abounding in small stones.



<u>precarious</u>	Fraught with danger. <i>He made a <b>precarious</b> living as a painter.</i>
problematic	Open to doubt or debate. If you ever get married which seems to be extremely <b>problematic</b> .
rickety	Lacking bodily or muscular strength or vitality. <i>Rickety</i> limbs and joints.
rough	Not quite exact or correct. <b>Rough</b> blankets.
<u>rugged</u>	Very difficult; severely testing stamina or resolution. A <b>rugged</b> coastline.
<u>shaky</u>	Not safe or reliable; liable to fail or falter. Seemed <b>shaky</b> on her feet.
shingly	Abounding in small stones. Landed at a <b>shingly</b> little beach.
stony	Showing unfeeling resistance to tender feelings. <i>Stony</i> steps.
tottery	Unsteady in gait as from infirmity or old age. A <b>tottery</b> old man.
<u>uncertain</u>	(of a person) not completely confident or sure of something. <i>Changes of great if <b>uncertain</b> consequences.</i>
undependable	Not worthy of reliance or trust. An <b>undependable</b> generalization.
unreliable	Lacking a sense of responsibility. An <b>unreliable</b> trestle.
<u>unstable</u>	Highly or violently reactive. <i>The <b>unstable</b> cliff tops.</i>
<u>unsteady</u>	Liable to fall or shake; not steady in position. Nathan pushed the mug into her <b>unsteady</b> hand.
<u>unsure</u>	Lacking self-confidence. <b>Unsure</b> of himself and his future.
up and down	In readiness.
wobbly	(of a person or voice) tending to move out of tone or slightly vary in pitch. <i>The car had a <b>wobbly</b> wheel.</i>

- Hillsides of dry, rocky soil.
