Associations of "Roll out" (30 Words)

bevel	Cut a bevel on shape to a bevel. <i>Polish the face of the plate and bevel the edge.</i>
cartouche	A decorative architectural feature, such as a modillion or corbel, resembling a scroll. <i>A coat of arms in a cartouche.</i>
coil	A single ring in a coil. <i>Many women don t like the idea of having a coil fitted.</i>
convolute	Rolled longitudinally upon itself, as a leaf in the bud. <i>A convolute petal.</i>
convolve	Roll or coil together; entwine.
curl	A curling movement. <i>Large perm rods give volume and control rather than lots of curl.</i>
curve	Form a curl curve or kink. <i>Her mouth curved in a smile.</i>
exhale	Breathe out. <i>The chimney exhales a thick smoke.</i>
flounder	Behave awkwardly; have difficulties. <i>She is floundering in college.</i>
gyre	A spiral or vortex. <i>The central North Pacific gyre.</i>
helical	In the shape of a coil. <i>Helical molecules.</i>
helix	A curve on a conical or cylindrical surface which would become a straight line if the surface were unrolled into a plane.
herring	Valuable flesh of fatty fish from shallow waters of northern Atlantic or Pacific; usually salted or pickled.
hogshead	A British unit of capacity for alcoholic beverages.

mackerel	Flesh of very important usually small (to 18 in) fatty Atlantic fish.
papyrus	A document written on papyrus. <i>A remarkable papyrus recently acquired by the British Museum.</i>
ringlet	Any of various butterflies belonging to the family Satyridae. <i>Her hair fell loose in ringlets.</i>
scroll	An ancient book or document written on a scroll. <i>If scroll is enabled the window scrolls down.</i>
spin	Fish with a spinner. <i>The figures were enough to make her head spin.</i>
spiral	To wind or move in a spiral course. <i>An inflationary spiral.</i>
spiraling	In the shape of a coil.
swirl	The shape of something rotating rapidly. <i>She emerged with a swirl of skirts.</i>
toilet	Assist or supervise someone especially an infant or invalid in using a toilet. <i>He got up to go to the toilet.</i>
tuna	The flesh of the tuna as food.
vaulted	Having a hemispherical vault or dome. <i>An unusual brick vaulted ceiling.</i>
wallow	An act of wallowing. <i>A buffalo wallow.</i>
whirl	Move or cause to move rapidly. <i>Leaves whirled in eddies of wind.</i>
whorl	A round shape formed by a series of concentric circles (as formed by leaves or flower petals). <i>Shelley drew larger and larger dark whorls on her notepad.</i>
wind	Make a baby bring up wind after feeding by patting its back. <i>She hit the floor with a thud that knocked the wind out of her.</i>
