According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “romanticize” as a verb can have the following definitions:

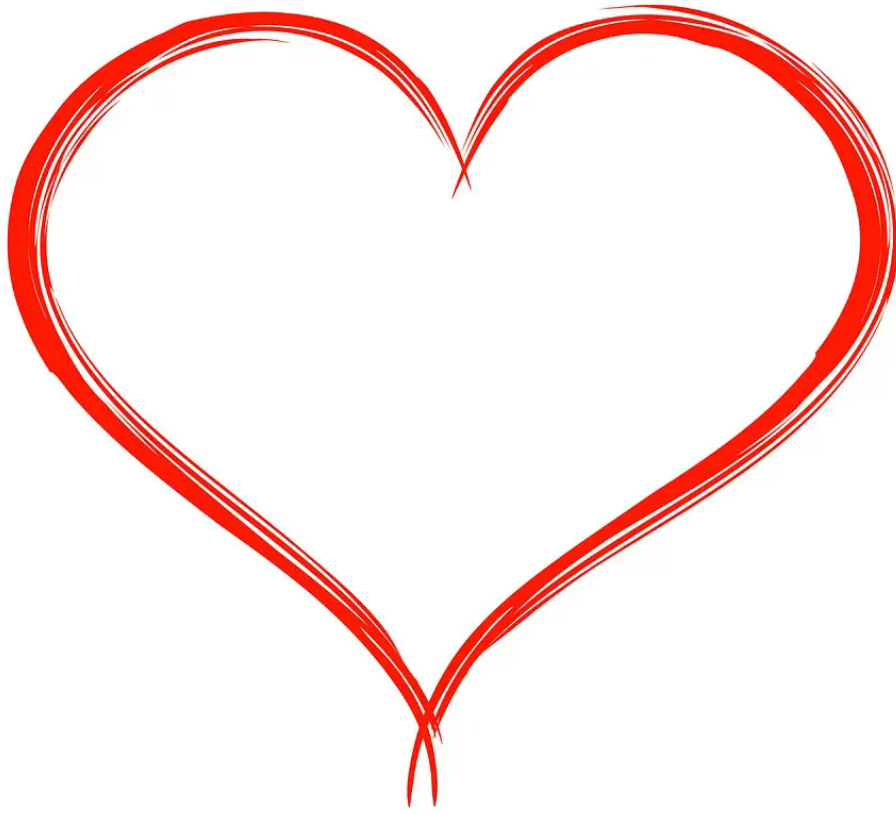
- *Make romantic in style.*

- *Act in a romantic way.*
- *Deal with or describe in an idealized or unrealistic fashion; make (something) seem better or more appealing than it really is.*



## Synonyms of "Romanticize" as a verb (16 Words)

<b>add dignity to</b>	State or say further.
<b>add distinction to</b>	Bestow a quality on.
<b>add lustre to</b>	Make an addition (to); join or combine or unite with others; increase the quality, quantity, size or scope of.
<b>augment</b>	Enlarge or increase. <i>He <b>augmented</b> his summer income by painting houses.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The singer had to be <b>boosted</b> onto the stage by a special contraption.</i>
<b>dignify</b>	Raise the status of. <i>I shall not <b>dignify</b> this insensitive remark with an answer.</i>
<b><u>elevate</u></b>	Increase the level of (something). <i>The exercise will naturally <b>elevate</b> your chest and head.</i>

<b>enhance</b>	Make better or more attractive. <i>This sauce will <b>enhance</b> the flavor of the meat.</i>
<b><u>ennoble</u></b>	Give a title to someone; make someone a member of the nobility. <i>They receive life baronies on appointment unless they are already <b>ennobled</b>.</i>
<b>exalt</b>	Raise to a higher rank or position. <i>This naturally <b>exalts</b> the peasant above his brethren in the same rank of society.</i>
<b>glamorize</b>	Interpret romantically. <i>The lyrics <b>glamorize</b> drugs.</i>
<b>glamourise</b>	Interpret romantically.
<b>increase</b>	Become or make greater in size, amount, or degree. <i>The university <b>increased</b> the number of students it admitted.</i>
<b>lift up</b>	Cancel officially.
<b>promote</b>	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>Some regulation is still required to <b>promote</b> competition.</i>
<b>romanticise</b>	Interpret romantically.

- *The tendency to romanticize non-industrial societies.*
- *The designer romanticized the little black dress.*
