<b><a href="#">arboreal</a></b>	Relating to trees. <i><b>Arboreal</b> rodents.</i>
<b>arborescent</b>	Resembling a tree in form and branching structure. <i><b>Arborescent</b> succulents.</i>
<b><a href="#">base</a></b>	Of low birth or station base is archaic in this sense. <i>She uses existing data as the <b>base</b> for the study.</i>
<b>beginning</b>	The act of starting something. <i>They had reached the <b>beginning</b> of the wood.</i>
<b>cause</b>	Cause to do cause to act in a specified manner. <i>They are trying to determine the <b>cause</b> of the crash.</i>
<b>coniferous</b>	Of or relating to or part of trees or shrubs bearing cones and evergreen leaves.
<b><a href="#">cornerstone</a></b>	A stone that forms the base of a corner of a building, joining two walls. <i>A national minimum wage remained the <b>cornerstone</b> of policy.</i>
<b>foundation</b>	The action of establishing an institution or organization. <i>The <b>foundation</b> of a civil service college.</i>
<b>groundwork</b>	Lowest support of a structure. <i>The inquiry's findings are expected to lay the <b>groundwork</b> for a complete overhaul of the system.</i>
<b>grove</b>	A small wood or other group of trees. <i>An olive <b>grove</b>.</i>
<b>hypostasis</b>	(metaphysics) essential nature or underlying reality.
<b>implanted</b>	Deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held. <i><b>Implanted</b> convictions.</i>
<b>initially</b>	At the beginning. <i><b>Initially</b> he thought the new concept was nonsense.</i>

<b>log</b>	Enter an incident or fact in the log of a ship or aircraft or in another systematic record. <i>The virus can <b>log</b> keystrokes that you make when you access all sorts of services.</i>
<b>nature</b>	The essential qualities or characteristics by which something is recognized. <i>It s not in her <b>nature</b> to listen to advice.</i>
<b>oak</b>	A smoky flavour or nose characteristic of wine aged in barrels made from oak wood. <i>Soft <b>oak</b> overtones.</i>
<b>origin</b>	A place where a nerve or blood vessel begins or branches from a main nerve or blood vessel. <i>He comes from good <b>origins</b>.</i>
<b>original</b>	An original creation i e an audio recording from which copies can be made. <i>The book still has its <b>original</b> binding.</i>
<b>originally</b>	From or in the beginning; at first. <i>Potatoes <b>originally</b> came from South America.</i>
<b>radix</b>	The positive integer that is equivalent to one in the next higher counting place. <i>Judaism is the <b>radix</b> of Christianity.</i>
<b>reed</b>	A wind instrument played with a reed. <i>A harvest of thatching <b>reeds</b>.</i>
<b>rooted</b>	Absolutely still. <i>The front wheel looks <b>rooted</b>.</i>
<b>sapwood</b>	The soft outer layers of recently formed wood between the heartwood and the bark, containing the functioning vascular tissue.
<b>source</b>	Obtain from a particular source. <i>The writer carefully <b>sourced</b> her report.</i>
<b>stem</b>	Remove the stems from fruit or tobacco leaves. <i>For automatic natural language processing the words must be <b>stemmed</b>.</i>
<b>tree</b>	Force a hunted animal to take refuge in a tree. <i>The hunters <b>treed</b> the bear with dogs and killed it.</i>
<b>trunk</b>	A large box with a hinged lid for storing or transporting clothes and other articles. <i>He put his golf bag in the <b>trunk</b>.</i>
<b>unabridged</b>	Not shortened. <i>An <b>unabridged</b> novel.</i>

**willow** A tree or shrub of temperate climates which typically has narrow leaves, bears catkins, and grows near water. Its pliant branches yield osiers for basketry, and the timber is traditionally used to make cricket bats.

**woodland** Land that is covered with trees and shrubs.  
*Large areas of ancient **woodland**.*
