- *A dusty pink color.*
- *A warm pink or light crimson colour.*
- *A stylized representation of a rose in heraldry or decoration, typically with five petals (especially as a national emblem of England).*
- *A prickly bush or shrub that typically bears red, pink, yellow, or white fragrant flowers, native to north temperate regions and widely grown as an ornamental.*
- *A perforated cap attached to a shower, the spout of a watering can, or the end of a hose to produce a spray.*
- *Pinkish table wine from red grapes whose skins were removed after fermentation*

- *Used to refer to favourable circumstances or ease of success.*
- *Used in names of other plants whose flowers resemble roses, e.g. Christmas rose, rose of Sharon.*
- *A rose regarded as an emblem of beauty, delicacy, or purity.*

## Synonyms of "Rose" as a noun (13 Words)

<b>atomizer</b>	A dispenser that turns a liquid (such as perfume) into a fine mist. <i>Spray the bouquet with water from an <b>atomizer</b> to keep it fresh.</i>
<b>blush wine</b>	Sudden reddening of the face (as from embarrassment or guilt or shame or modesty).
<b>head</b>	The head regarded as the location of intellect imagination and memory. <i>A pin<b>head</b> is the <b>head</b> of a pin.</i>
<a href="#"><u>nose</u></a>	A front that resembles a human nose especially the front of an aircraft. <i>My horse lost the race by a <b>nose</b>.</i>
<b>nozzle</b>	A cylindrical or round spout at the end of a pipe, hose, or tube used to control a jet of gas or liquid. <i>He twisted the <b>nozzle</b> of the shower head.</i>
<b>pink wine</b>	Any of various flowers of plants of the genus <i>Dianthus</i> cultivated for their fragrant flowers.
<b>rose wine</b>	A dusty pink color.
<b>rosebush</b>	Any of many shrubs of the genus <i>Rosa</i> that bear roses.
<b>rosiness</b>	A dusty pink color.
<b>spout</b>	The plume of water vapour ejected from the blowhole of a whale. <i>The <b>spout</b> of an occasional whale.</i>
<a href="#"><u>spray</u></a>	A pesticide in suspension or solution intended for spraying. <i>A <b>spray</b> of bullets.</i>
<b>sprinkler</b>	Mechanical device that attaches to a garden hose for watering lawn or garden.
<b>sprinkler head</b>	Mechanical device that attaches to a garden hose for watering lawn or garden.

**rosaceous** Relating to or denoting plants of the rose family (Rosaceae ).

**roseate** Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern.

## Associations of "Rose" (30 Words)

<b>alder</b>	Wood of any of various alder trees resistant to underwater rot used for bridges etc.
<b>birch</b>	Hard close grained wood of any of various birch trees used especially in furniture and interior finishes and plywood. <i>There were calls to bring back the <b>birch</b>.</i>
<b>bush</b>	Vegetation growing in the bush. <i>A rose <b>bush</b>.</i>
<u><b>cactus</b></u>	Any succulent plant of the family Cactaceae native chiefly to arid regions of the New World and usually having spines.
<b>carmine</b>	Color carmine. <i><b>Carmine</b> roses.</i>
<u><b>crimson</b></u>	A deep and vivid red color. <i>A pair of corduroy trousers in livid <b>crimson</b> they were horrid to behold.</i>

<b>elm</b>	Hard tough wood of an elm tree used for e g implements and furniture.
<b>flower</b>	The state or period in which a plant s flowers have developed and opened. <i>A bunch of <b>flowers</b>.</i>
<b>green</b>	Consisting of fresh green vegetables. <i><b>Green</b> fields.</i>
<b>hawthorn</b>	A thorny shrub or tree of the rose family, with white, pink, or red blossom and small dark red fruits (haws). Native to north temperate regions, it is commonly used for hedging in Britain.
<a href="#"><u>leaf</u></a>	A thing that resembles a leaf in being flat and thin. <i>The trees are still in <b>leaf</b>.</i>
<b>lily</b>	Used in names of other plants with flowers or leaves similar to those of the lily e g arum lily.
<b>maple</b>	Wood of any of various maple trees especially the hard close grained wood of the sugar maple used especially for furniture and flooring.
<b>orchid</b>	Any of numerous plants of the orchid family usually having flowers of unusual shapes and beautiful colors.
<b>outback</b>	Inaccessible and sparsely populated. <i>A two week tour of the <b>outback</b>.</i>
<b>petiole</b>	A slender stalk between two structures, especially that between the abdomen and thorax of a wasp or ant.
<b>pimpernel</b>	Any of several plants of the genus Anagallis.
<a href="#"><u>pink</u></a>	The pink ball in snooker. <i>Cheryl s cheeks <b>pinked</b> with sudden excitement.</i>
<b>prickly</b>	Very irritable. <i>He became <b>prickly</b> and spiteful.</i>
<a href="#"><u>purple</u></a>	Purple clothing or material. <i>He was born to the <b>purple</b>.</i>
<b>red</b>	Of a ski run of the second highest level of difficulty as indicated by red markers positioned along it. <i>Which dress the black or the <b>red</b>.</i>
<b>roseate</b>	Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern. <i>The <b>roseate</b> glow of dawn.</i>
<b>ruddy</b>	Make ruddy in colour. <i>The <b>ruddy</b> evening light.</i>
<a href="#"><u>scarlet</u></a>	Scarlet clothes or material. <i>A mass of <b>scarlet</b> berries.</i>
<b>shrub</b>	A low woody perennial plant usually having several major stems.



**spinous** Having spines.  
*The dorsal fin is **spinous**.*

**strawberry** The low growing plant which produces the strawberry having white flowers lobed leaves and runners and found throughout north temperate regions.  
*She thought she would wear the **strawberry** crushed velvet.*

**thorn** A thorny bush shrub or tree especially a hawthorn.  
*The issue has become a **thorn** in renewing the peace talks.*

**tulip** A bulbous spring-flowering plant of the lily family, with boldly coloured cup-shaped flowers.

**white** White colour or pigment.  
*She separated the **whites** from the yolks of several eggs.*
