- *A list of members of a team or organization, in particular of sports players available for team selection.*
- *A list of names.*



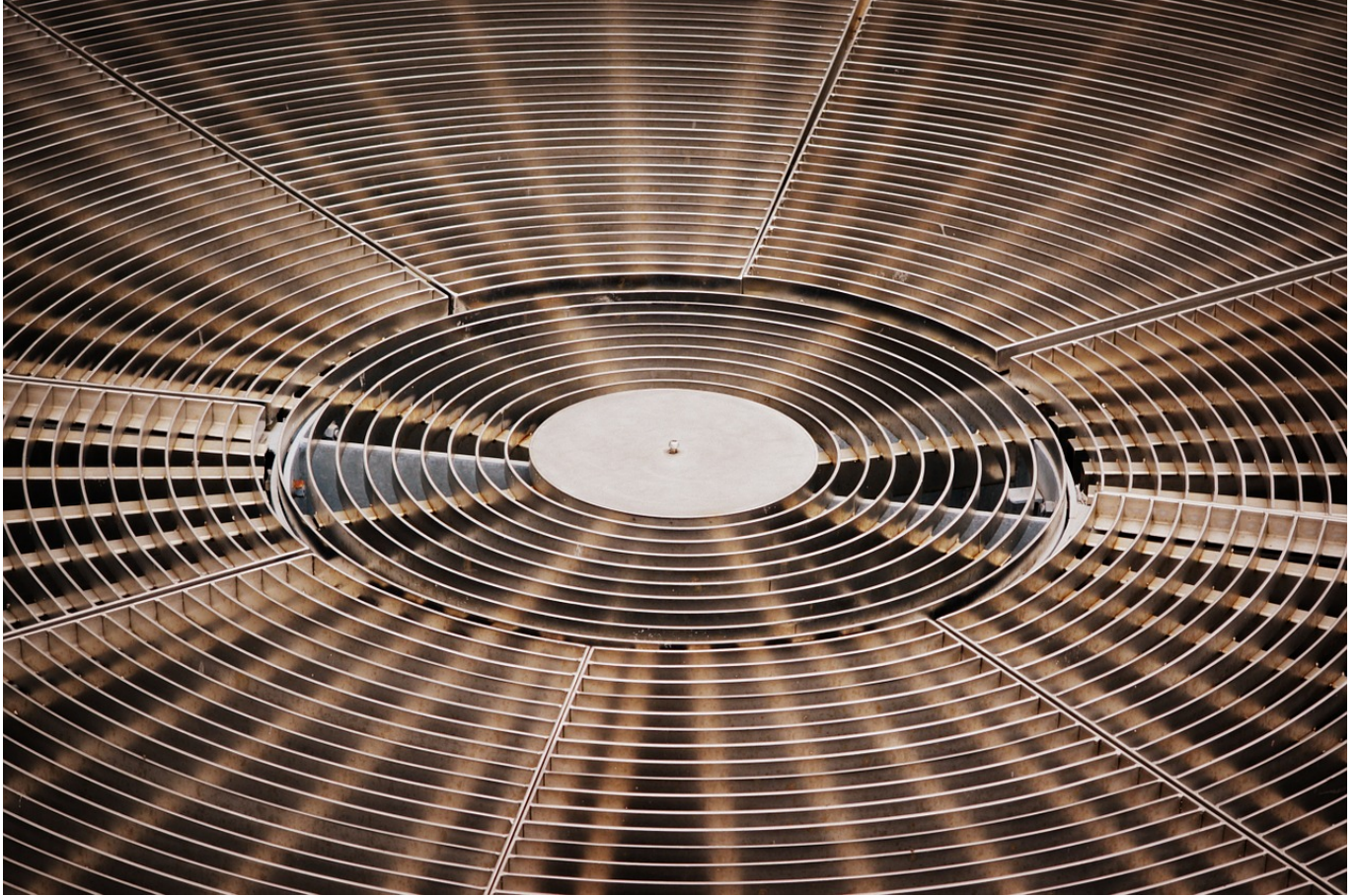
## Synonyms of "Roster" as a noun (9 Words)

- agenda** The underlying intentions or motives of a particular person or group.  
*The question of nuclear weapons had been removed from the **agenda**.*
- calendar** A system by which the beginning, length, and subdivisions of the year are fixed.  
*I have you on my **calendar** for next Monday.*
- directory** (computer science) a listing of the files stored in memory (usually on a hard disk).
- list** A formal structure analogous to a list by which items of data can be stored or processed in a definite order.  
*Consult the **list** of drugs on page 326.*
- listing** A list or catalogue.
- register** A cashbox with an adding machine to register transactions used in shops to add up the bill.  
*The system requires teachers to take the **register** at each lesson.*
- roll** The total number of names on a roll.  
*A **roll** of carpet.*
- schedule** A temporally organized plan for matters to be attended to.  
*Take a moment out of your busy **schedule**.*
- table** A list of rivals or competitors showing their positions relative to one another a league table.  
*She put the plate on the **table**.*



## Usage Examples of "Roster" as a noun

- *A cluster of outstanding players on the club's roster.*
- *The label assembled an extraordinarily eclectic roster of artists.*
- *Next week's duty roster.*



## Associations of "Roster" (30 Words)

<b>alphabetical</b>	Relating to an alphabet. <i>An <b>alphabetical</b> index.</i>
<b>anonymously</b>	In a way that prevents a person from being identified by name. <i>The <b>anonymously</b> furnished parlour.</i>
<b>catalog</b>	Make a catalogue compile a catalogue. <i>It does not pretend to be a <b>catalog</b> of his achievements.</i>
<b>catalogue</b>	Enter an item in a catalogue. <i>A computerized library <b>catalogue</b>.</i>
<b><u>checklist</u></b>	A list of items (names or tasks etc.) to be checked or consulted.
<b>discography</b>	The study of musical recordings and compilation of descriptive catalogues. <i>The factual reliability is commendable he clearly had a good <b>discography</b> to hand.</i>

<b>document</b>	Support or accompany with documentation. <i>The parents <b>documented</b> every step of their child s development.</i>
<b>documentation</b>	The process of classifying and annotating texts, photographs, etc. <i>His <b>documentation</b> of the results was excellent.</i>
<b>employee</b>	A worker who is hired to perform a job.
<b>enlist</b>	Hire for work or assistance. <i>Hundreds of thousands of recruits had been <b>enlisted</b>.</i>
<b>enrol</b>	Enter (a deed or other document) among the rolls of a court of justice. <i>All entrants will be <b>enrolled</b> on new style courses.</i>
<b>enroll</b>	Register formally as a participant or member.
<b>enumerate</b>	Determine the number or amount of. <i>There is not space to <b>enumerate</b> all his works.</i>
<b>file</b>	Smooth with a file. <i>You can save the <b>file</b> to your hard disk.</i>
<b>index</b>	Adjust through indexation. <i>The Supreme Soviet passed legislation <b>indexing</b> wages to prices.</i>
<b>item</b>	Also Philip Guedalla used when listing or enumerating items. <i>An <b>item</b> of clothing.</i>
<b>itemize</b>	Break down (a whole) into its constituent parts. <i>An <b>itemized</b> bill.</i>
<b>label</b>	Attach a label to something. <i>Independent <b>labels</b>.</i>
<b>lean</b>	Cause to lean to the side. <i>He <b>leaned</b> his elbows on the table.</i>
<b>list</b>	Include in a list. <i>I have <b>listed</b> four reasons below.</i>
<b>membership</b>	The fact of being a member of a group. <i>A <b>membership</b> card.</i>
<b>necrology</b>	A notice of someone's death; usually includes a short biography.
<b>payroll</b>	A list of a company's employees and the amount of money they are to be paid. <i>There are just three employees on the <b>payroll</b>.</i>
<b>portfolio</b>	A range of investments held by a person or organization. <i>A <b>portfolio</b> of insured municipal securities.</i>
<b>receptionist</b>	A person who greets and deals with clients and visitors to a surgery, office, etc.

- recruit** A recently enlisted soldier.  
*The party **recruited** many new members.*
- register** Put one's name in a register as a guest in a hotel.  
*At the store's bridal registry single people can **register** for gifts even if they are not getting married.*
- tab** The key on a typewriter or a word processor that causes a tabulation.  
*Pull the **tab** to open the can.*
- tabloid** A newspaper having pages half the size of those of the average broadsheet, typically popular in style and dominated by sensational stories.  
*A **tabloid** TV show.*
- tilt** Charge with a tilt.  
***Tilting** the camera causes convergence of upright lines.*
