## Associations of "Routinely" (30 Words)

<b>accepted</b>	Generally believed or recognized to be valid or correct. <i>The <b>accepted</b> consensus within the church.</i>
<a href="#"><u>accustomed</u></a>	Customary; usual. <i>His <b>accustomed</b> thoroughness.</i>
<b>always</b>	For all future time; forever. <i>She is <b>always</b> making derogatory remarks.</i>
<b>basically</b>	In the most essential respects; fundamentally. <i>He is <b>basically</b> dishonest.</i>
<a href="#"><u>broadly</u></a>	In general and without considering minor details. <i>He was grinning <b>broadly</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>chiefly</u></a>	Mainly. <i>He is remembered <b>chiefly</b> for his organ sonatas.</i>
<b>commonly</b>	Under normal conditions. <i>Shift workers <b>commonly</b> complain of not getting enough sleep.</i>
<a href="#"><u>consist</u></a>	Be consistent in form tenor or character be congruous. <i>The information perfectly <b>consists</b> with our friend s account.</i>
<b>customarily</b>	By custom; according to common practice. <i>The leaves are <b>customarily</b> used for animal fodder.</i>
<a href="#"><u>essentially</u></a>	In essence; at bottom or by one's (or its) very nature. <i>The argument was <b>essentially</b> a technical one.</i>
<a href="#"><u>ever</u></a>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Did you <b>ever</b> smoke.</i>
<b>exceptionally</b>	To an exceptional degree. <i>The weather was <b>exceptionally</b> mild for the time of the year.</i>
<a href="#"><u>generally</u></a>	Usually; as a rule. <i>The best scheme is <b>generally</b> reckoned to be the Canadian one.</i>

<b>habitually</b>	By way of habit; customarily. <i>He <b>habitually</b> carried a pocket knife.</i>
<b>infrequently</b>	Not many times. <i>He cooks but only <b>infrequently</b>.</i>
<b><u>largely</u></b>	On a large scale. <i>These accounts are <b>largely</b> inactive.</i>
<b><u>mainly</u></b>	For the most part. <i>He is <b>mainly</b> interested in butterflies.</i>
<b><u>mostly</u></b>	In large part; mainly or chiefly. <i>I made some good friends but <b>mostly</b> met closed minded people.</i>
<b><u>normally</u></b>	Under normal conditions. <i>Try to breathe <b>normally</b>.</i>
<b>ordinarily</b>	In a normal way. <i>A person who is <b>ordinarily</b> resident in the United Kingdom.</i>
<b><u>overwhelmingly</u></b>	Incapable of being resisted. <i>The country voted <b>overwhelmingly</b> for independence.</i>
<b>pantechnicon</b>	A large moving van (especially one used for moving furniture).
<b>predominantly</b>	Much greater in number or influence. <i><b>Predominantly</b> Russian areas.</i>
<b><u>primarily</u></b>	Of primary import. <i>This is <b>primarily</b> a question of economics.</i>
<b>principally</b>	For the most part. <i>He was <b>principally</b> a landscape painter.</i>
<b><u>regularly</u></b>	Frequently. <i>Make a point of <b>regularly</b> consulting the noticeboard.</i>
<b><u>typically</u></b>	In a typical manner. <i>The quality of work is <b>typically</b> very high.</i>
<b>universally</b>	Everywhere. <i>Progress is not always <b>universally</b> welcomed.</i>
<b>usually</b>	Under normal conditions. <i>Heat resistant paints are <b>usually</b> black or aluminium coloured.</i>
<b><u>wont</u></b>	Make or be or become accustomed. <i>He was <b>wont</b> to arise at 5 30 every morning.</i>
