<u>overlord</u>	A person who has general authority over others. <i>The Jews rebelled against their Roman overlords.</i>
potentate	A monarch or ruler, especially an autocratic one.
prince	A male member of a royal family other than the sovereign (especially the son of a sovereign). <i>Arctic char is a prince among fishes.</i>
princess	The daughter of a monarch. <i>Is something the matter princess.</i>
queen	One of four face cards in a deck bearing a picture of a queen. <i>The queen of the social columns.</i>
royal stag	A sail set next above the topgallant on a royal mast.
<u>ruler</u>	A straight strip or cylinder of plastic, wood, metal, or other rigid material, typically marked at regular intervals and used to draw straight lines or measure distances.
<u>sovereign</u>	A former British gold coin worth one pound sterling, now only minted for commemorative purposes. <i>The Emperor became the first Japanese sovereign to visit Britain.</i>
tsar	An emperor of Russia before 1917. <i>Tsar Nicholas II.</i>
tsarina	An empress of Russia before 1917. <i>The Germanic origins of the tsarina.</i>

princely	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>The princely states of India.</i>
purple	Belonging to or befitting a supreme ruler. <i>Purple tyrant.</i>
queenlike	Having the rank of or resembling or befitting a queen.
queenly	Having the rank of or resembling or befitting a queen. <i>Queenly propriety.</i>
real	Coinciding with reality. <i>Statistics demonstrate that poverty and unemployment are very real problems.</i>
regal	Belonging to or befitting a supreme ruler. <i>Regal attire.</i>
sovereign	Possessing royal power and status. <i>In modern democracies the people's will is in theory sovereign.</i>
splendid	Excellent; very good. <i>His robes were splendid.</i>
superb	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g. superb lyrebird. <i>The Bey of Tunis was building himself a superb mausoleum.</i>
thorough	Performed or written with great care and completeness. <i>Thorough research.</i>
total	Comprising the whole number or amount. <i>A total disaster.</i>
utter	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Utter nonsense.</i>

veritable

Used for emphasis, often to qualify a metaphor.

*He s a **veritable** swine.*

wonderful

Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers.

*They all think she s **wonderful**.*

<u>emperor</u>	Large moth of temperate forests of Eurasia having heavily scaled transparent wings. <i>He is regarded as one of the greatest Roman emperors.</i>
<u>empire</u>	A group of countries under a single authority. <i>The British created a great empire.</i>
<u>imperial</u>	Relating to or associated with an empire. <i>The bedroom is huge and very imperial.</i>
<u>king</u>	A male sovereign ruler of a kingdom. <i>He ll start kinging it over the lot of us again.</i>
<u>kingdom</u>	A country with a king as head of state. <i>The kingdom of dreams.</i>
liege	A vassal or subject. <i>One s liege lord.</i>
<u>lord</u>	Make a lord of someone. <i>Lords and ladies were entertained here.</i>
monarchy	An autocracy governed by a monarch who usually inherits the authority. <i>The monarchy is the focus of loyalty and service.</i>
<u>noble</u>	Especially in former times a person of noble rank or birth. <i>The greater a noble s military power the more land he could control.</i>
<u>palace</u>	A large and impressive building forming the official residence of a ruler, pope, archbishop, etc. <i>The royal palace.</i>
patrician	Belonging to or characteristic of the aristocracy. <i>Patrician tastes.</i>
prince	A male monarch of a small state, actually, nominally, or originally subject to a king or emperor. <i>He was the prince of a small kingdom that was now part of Pakistan.</i>
princess	The wife or widow of a prince. <i>Stop being such a princess.</i>
principality	(in traditional Christian angelology) the fifth-highest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy.
queen	Become a queen. <i>She s the official carnival queen.</i>

regal	Belonging to or befitting a supreme ruler. <i>Her regal bearing.</i>
regalia	Paraphernalia indicative of royalty (or other high office). <i>The Bishop of Florence in full regalia.</i>
regency	The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a regency.</i>
royalty	A sum paid to a patentee for the use of a patent or to an author or composer for each copy of a book sold or for each public performance of a work. <i>She swept by as if she were royalty.</i>
ruler	A person exercising government or dominion.
scepter	The imperial authority symbolized by a scepter.
sovereign	Very good or effective. <i>The Emperor became the first Japanese sovereign to visit Britain.</i>
