brouhaha A noisy and overexcited reaction or response to something.

All that election **brouhaha**.

clamour Loud and persistent outcry from many people.

The growing public **clamour** for more police officers on the beat.

Civil insurrection.

She was distracted by a **commotion** across the street.

A loud harsh or strident noise.

The fans made an awful din.

Activity that is a malfunction, intrusion, or interruption.

Children with learning difficulty and personality **disturbance**.

furore A sudden outburst (as of protest.

The verdict raised a **furore** over the role of courtroom psychiatry.

fuss A rapid active commotion.

I don t know what all the **fuss** is about.

hue and cry The quality of a color as determined by its dominant wavelength.

maelstrom A powerful circular current of water (usually the result of conflicting tides.

The train station was a **maelstrom** of crowds.



melee A noisy riotous fight.

Several people were hurt in the **melee**.

palaver Unnecessarily elaborate or complex procedure.

An hour of aimless **palaver**.

racket A snowshoe resembling a racket.

A squash **racket**.

ruction Angry reactions, protests, or complaints.

If Mrs Salt catches her there ll be **ruction**s.

A noisy disturbance; a row.

rumpus

He caused a rumpus with his flair for troublemaking.

stir An act of stirring food or drink.

He gives his Ovaltine a stir.

storm Storm windows.

The book caused a **storm** in America.

to-do A disorderly outburst or tumult.

tumult A loud, confused noise, especially one caused by a large mass of people.

His personal **tumult** ended when he began writing songs.

A loud and impassioned noise or disturbance.

The room was in an **uproar**.
