Cheerfully bearing reproaches but **shamefaced** at praise.

sheepish Like or suggestive of a sheep in docility or stupidity or meekness or timidity.

A **sheepish** grin.

sorrowful Feeling or showing grief.

A **sorrowful** tale of death and despair.

Feeling regret or penitence.

I felt **sorry** for the poor boys working for him.
