## Associations of "Run away" (30 Words)

<b>amble</b>	Walk leisurely. <i>A peaceful riverside <b>amble</b>.</i>
<b>apart</b>	Used after a noun to indicate that someone or something has qualities which mark them out from other people or things. <i>He leapt out of the car just before it was blown <b>apart</b>.</i>
<b>aside</b>	Not taken into account or excluded from consideration. <i>All joking <b>aside</b> I think you re crazy.</i>
<b>canter</b>	Ride at a cantering pace. <i>We came back from one of our <b>canters</b>.</i>
<b>dash</b>	A short vertical mark placed above or beneath a note to indicate that it is to be performed in a very staccato manner. <i>I must <b>dash</b> I m late.</i>
<b>depart</b>	Leave. <i>He will soon <b>depart</b> his post as high commissioner to Britain.</i>
<b>detached</b>	Showing lack of emotional involvement. <i>A four bedroomed <b>detached</b> house.</i>
<b>deviate</b>	A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior. <i>Their <b>deviate</b> behaviour.</i>
<b>far</b>	Located at a great distance in time or space or degree. <i>A <b>far</b> trek.</i>
<b>farther</b>	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i><b>Farther</b> from the truth.</i>
<b>flit</b>	An act of moving house or leaving one’s home, typically secretly so as to escape creditors or obligations. <i>Small birds <b>flitted</b> about in the branches.</i>

<b>gait</b>	The pattern of steps of a horse or dog at a particular speed. <i>The easy <b>gait</b> of an athlete.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Having minimal contact or little in common with others. <i>An <b>isolated</b> pawn.</i>
<b>jog</b>	A spell of jogging. <i>He began to <b>jog</b> along the road.</i>
<b>jogger</b>	Loose trousers made of a stretchy fabric and typically elasticated at the waist and ankles, worn especially for jogging. <i>There are <b>joggers</b> on every road.</i>
<b>jogging</b>	Denoting a garment designed to be worn while jogging. <i>Some gentle <b>jogging</b> for a few weeks before the event should prevent any aching or stiffness.</i>
<b>marathon</b>	A long-lasting or difficult task or activity. <i>She s embarking on a <b>marathon</b> UK tour.</i>
<b>race</b>	A series of races for horses or dogs held at a fixed time on a set course. <i>She spoke automatically while her mind <b>raced</b> ahead.</i>
<b>ramble</b>	(of a plant) put out long shoots and grow over walls or other plants. <i>This novel <b>rambles</b> on and jogs.</i>
<b>runner</b>	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>The vegetable baskets were on <b>runners</b>.</i>
<b>running</b>	Of advancing the ball by running. <i>The coach put great emphasis on <b>running</b>.</i>
<b>sidetrack</b>	A minor path or track. <i>The horse took a <b>sidetrack</b> which led uphill.</i>
<b>sprint</b>	A quick run. <i>Greg broke into a <b>sprint</b>.</i>
<b>stray</b>	A stray person or thing especially a domestic animal. <i>A <b>stray</b> calf.</i>
<b>stride</b>	Bestride. <i>The speaker was getting into his <b>stride</b>.</i>
<b>stroll</b>	A leisurely walk (usually in some public place). <i>I <b>strolled</b> around the city.</i>
<b>stroller</b>	A person taking a leisurely walk. <i>Shady gardens where <b>strollers</b> could relax.</i>
<b>trainer</b>	A soft sports shoe suitable for casual wear. <i>A fitness <b>trainer</b>.</i>

**walker** A person who walks, especially for exercise or enjoyment.  
*A fell **walker**.*

**wander** An act or instance of wandering.  
*He found her **wandering** the streets.*
