## Associations of "Run away" (30 Words)

amble	Walk leisurely. A peaceful riverside <b>amble</b> .
<u>apart</u>	Used after a noun to indicate that someone or something has qualities which mark them out from other people or things. <i>He leapt out of the car just before it was blown <b>apart</b>.</i>
<u>aside</u>	Not taken into account or excluded from consideration. All joking <b>aside</b> I think you re crazy.
canter	Ride at a cantering pace. We came back from one of our <b>canter</b> s.
dash	A short vertical mark placed above or beneath a note to indicate that it is to be performed in a very staccato manner. <i>I must dash I m late.</i>
<u>depart</u>	Leave. He will soon <b>depart</b> his post as high commissioner to Britain.
detached	Showing lack of emotional involvement. A four bedroomed <b>detached</b> house.
<u>deviate</u>	A person whose behavior deviates from what is acceptable especially in sexual behavior. <i>Their deviate behaviour.</i>
<u>far</u>	Located at a great distance in time or space or degree. A <b>far</b> trek.
farther	To or at a greater extent or degree or a more advanced stage further is used more often than farther in this abstract sense. <i>Farther</i> from the truth.
flit	An act of moving house or leaving one's home, typically secretly so as to escape creditors or obligations. Small birds <b>flit</b> ted about in the branches.



gait	The pattern of steps of a horse or dog at a particular speed. The easy <b>gait</b> of an athlete.
isolated	Having minimal contact or little in common with others. An <b>isolated</b> pawn.
jog	A spell of jogging. He began to <b>jog</b> along the road.
jogger	Loose trousers made of a stretchy fabric and typically elasticated at the waist and ankles, worn especially for jogging. <i>There are <b>jogger</b>s on every road.</i>
jogging	Denoting a garment designed to be worn while jogging. Some gentle <b>jogging</b> for a few weeks before the event should prevent any aching or stiffness.
marathon	A long-lasting or difficult task or activity. She s embarking on a <b>marathon</b> UK tour.
race	A series of races for horses or dogs held at a fixed time on a set course. She spoke automatically while her mind <b>race</b> d ahead.
ramble	(of a plant) put out long shoots and grow over walls or other plants. <i>This novel</i> <b><i>ramble</i></b> <i>s on and jogs.</i>
runner	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>The vegetable baskets were on <b>runner</b>s.</i>
running	Of advancing the ball by running. The coach put great emphasis on <b>running</b> .
sidetrack	A minor path or track. The horse took a <b>sidetrack</b> which led uphill.
<u>sprint</u>	A quick run. Greg broke into a <b>sprint</b> .
<u>stray</u>	A stray person or thing especially a domestic animal. A <b>stray</b> calf.
stride	Bestride. <i>The speaker was getting into his <b>stride</b>.</i>
<u>stroll</u>	A leisurely walk (usually in some public place. I <b>stroll</b> ed around the city.
stroller	A person taking a leisurely walk. Shady gardens where <b>stroller</b> s could relax.
trainer	A soft sports shoe suitable for casual wear. A fitness <b>trainer</b> .



walker	A person who walks, especially for exercise or enjoyment. A fell <b>walker</b> .
<u>wander</u>	An act or instance of wandering. He found her <b>wander</b> ing the streets.
