- Any of various fungi causing rust disease in plants.
- A reddish-brown colour.
- The formation of reddish-brown ferric oxides on iron by low-temperature oxidation in the presence of water.
- A fungal disease of plants which results in reddish or brownish patches.
- A reddish- or yellowish-brown flaking coating of iron oxide that is formed on iron or steel by oxidation, especially in the presence of moisture.
- A plant disease that produces a reddish-brown discoloration of leaves and stems;



caused by various rust fungi.

• A red or brown oxide coating on iron or steel caused by the action of oxygen and moisture.

<u>tarnish</u>	Lose or cause to lose lustre, especially as a result of exposure to air or moisture. <i>Silver tarnishes too easily.</i>






Usage Examples of "Rust" as a verb

diggings	A site such as a mine or goldfield that has been excavated. <i>Hills scarred with peat diggings.</i>
erosive	Wearing away by friction. The erosive effects of waves on the shoreline.
gild	A formal association of people with similar interests. In 1436 he gild ed and painted statues for Bruges Town Hall.
gnaw	Become ground down or deteriorate. Gnaw an old cracker.
grate	Reduce food to small shreds by rubbing it on a grater. <i>Peel and roughly grate the carrots.</i>
hoary	Used in names of animals and plants covered with whitish fur or short hairs e g hoary bat hoary cress. <i>Hoary jokes</i> .
<u>metal</u>	Make or mend a road with road metal. The work also involves dealing with rock aggregates for potential use as suitable road metal .
necromancy	The supposed practice of communicating with the dead, especially in order to predict the future. Alchemy necromancy and other magic practices.
octave	The two notes at the extremes of an octave sounding together.
patina	The impression or appearance of something. A patina of good breeding.
platinum	Greyish white or silvery like platinum. A platinum wig.
