uncharitable unsympathetic.

unfeeling Lacking physical sensation or sensitivity.

He lowered his numb **unfeeling** body into a seat and closed his eyes.

unforgivingUnwilling or unable to forgive or show mercy.

The moor can be a wild and **unforgiving** place in bad weather.

Cruel or harsh; showing no mercy.

unmerciful Deceptively inflated incomes expose many couples to **unmerciful**

taxes.

unpitying Without mercy or pity.

A flat **unpitying** voice.

unrelenting Punishingly harsh.

unsparing

(of characters in literature or drama) tending to evoke antipathetic
