Associations of "S for blood" (30 Words)

aorta	The main artery of the body, supplying oxygenated blood to the circulatory system. In humans it passes over the heart from the left ventricle and runs down in front of the backbone.
arterial	Of or involving or contained in the arteries. <i>One of the main arterial routes from York.</i>
<u>artery</u>	A blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the body. <i>George Street main artery of Edinburgh s Golden Mile.</i>
bloodstream	The blood flowing through the circulatory system.
capillary	A tube of small internal diameter holds liquid by capillary action. <i>Capillary blood.</i>
cardiovascular	Of or pertaining to or involving the heart and blood vessels. <i>Increased risk of death from cardiovascular disease.</i>
clog	Dance a clog dance. <i>The leaves clog our drains in the Fall.</i>
clot	Form or cause to form clots. <i>Drugs that help blood to clot.</i>
coagulate	Cause (a fluid) to change to a solid or semi-solid state. <i>Blood had coagulated round the edges of the gash.</i>
coronary	Obstruction of blood flow in a coronary artery by a blood clot thrombus.
diabetes	A disease in which the body's ability to produce or respond to the hormone insulin is impaired, resulting in abnormal metabolism of carbohydrates and elevated levels of glucose in the blood.
embolism	Obstruction of an artery, typically by a clot of blood or an air bubble. <i>One patient died of a pulmonary embolism.</i>
erythrocyte	A mature blood cell that contains hemoglobin to carry oxygen to the bodily tissues; a biconcave disc that has no nucleus.

glucose	A syrup containing glucose and other sugars made by hydrolysis of starch and used in the food industry.
hemoglobin	A hemoprotein composed of globin and heme that gives red blood cells their characteristic color; function primarily to transport oxygen from the lungs to the body tissues. <i>Fish have simpler hemoglobin than mammals.</i>
hypertension	A state of great psychological stress.
inject	Take by injection. <i>He injected his voice with a confidence he didn't feel.</i>
insulin	A hormone produced in the pancreas by the islets of Langerhans which regulates the amount of glucose in the blood. The lack of insulin causes a form of diabetes.
intercellular	Located between cells. <i>Intercellular spaces.</i>
jugular	Relating to or located in the region of the neck or throat. <i>He always goes for the jugular.</i>
lipid	An oily organic compound insoluble in water but soluble in organic solvents; essential structural component of living cells (along with proteins and carbohydrates).
lymphatic	A vessel, similar to a vein, that conveys lymph in the body. <i>Lymphatic vessels.</i>
oxygenation	The process of providing or combining or treating with oxygen. <i>The oxygenation of the blood.</i>
plasma	Physical chemistry a fourth state of matter distinct from solid or liquid or gas and present in stars and fusion reactors a gas becomes a plasma when it is heated until the atoms lose all their electrons leaving a highly electrified collection of nuclei and free electrons. <i>Plasma physics.</i>
portal	A grand and imposing entrance (often extended metaphorically). <i>Many healthcare providers already utilize portals through which a patient can access test results.</i>
primogenitor	An ancestor, especially the earliest ancestor of a people; a progenitor.
pulmonary	Relating to the lungs. <i>Pulmonary disease.</i>
sepsis	The presence of pus-forming bacteria or their toxins in the blood or tissues.
vein	Make a veinlike pattern. <i>He felt the adrenaline course through his veins.</i>

venous Relating to a vein or the veins.
