## Associations of "S for blood" (30 Words)

<b>aorta</b>	The main artery of the body, supplying oxygenated blood to the circulatory system. In humans it passes over the heart from the left ventricle and runs down in front of the backbone.
<b>arterial</b>	Of or involving or contained in the arteries. <i>One of the main <b>arterial</b> routes from York.</i>
<a href="#">artery</a>	A blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the body. <i>George Street main <b>artery</b> of Edinburgh s Golden Mile.</i>
<b>bloodstream</b>	The blood flowing through the circulatory system.
<b>capillary</b>	A tube of small internal diameter holds liquid by capillary action. <i><b>Capillary</b> blood.</i>
<b>cardiovascular</b>	Of or pertaining to or involving the heart and blood vessels. <i>Increased risk of death from <b>cardiovascular</b> disease.</i>
<b>clog</b>	Dance a clog dance. <i>The leaves <b>clog</b> our drains in the Fall.</i>
<b>clot</b>	Form or cause to form clots. <i>Drugs that help blood to <b>clot</b>.</i>
<b>coagulate</b>	Cause (a fluid) to change to a solid or semi-solid state. <i>Blood had <b>coagulated</b> round the edges of the gash.</i>
<b>coronary</b>	Obstruction of blood flow in a coronary artery by a blood clot thrombus.
<b>diabetes</b>	A disease in which the body's ability to produce or respond to the hormone insulin is impaired, resulting in abnormal metabolism of carbohydrates and elevated levels of glucose in the blood.
<b>embolism</b>	Obstruction of an artery, typically by a clot of blood or an air bubble. <i>One patient died of a pulmonary <b>embolism</b>.</i>
<b>erythrocyte</b>	A mature blood cell that contains hemoglobin to carry oxygen to the bodily tissues; a biconcave disc that has no nucleus.

<b>glucose</b>	A syrup containing glucose and other sugars made by hydrolysis of starch and used in the food industry.
<b>hemoglobin</b>	A hemoprotein composed of globin and heme that gives red blood cells their characteristic color; function primarily to transport oxygen from the lungs to the body tissues. <i>Fish have simpler <b>hemoglobin</b> than mammals.</i>
<b>hypertension</b>	A state of great psychological stress.
<b>inject</b>	Take by injection. <i>He <b>injected</b> his voice with a confidence he didn't feel.</i>
<b>insulin</b>	A hormone produced in the pancreas by the islets of Langerhans which regulates the amount of glucose in the blood. The lack of insulin causes a form of diabetes.
<b>intercellular</b>	Located between cells. <i><b>Intercellular</b> spaces.</i>
<b>jugular</b>	Relating to or located in the region of the neck or throat. <i>He always goes for the <b>jugular</b>.</i>
<b>lipid</b>	An oily organic compound insoluble in water but soluble in organic solvents; essential structural component of living cells (along with proteins and carbohydrates).
<b>lymphatic</b>	A vessel, similar to a vein, that conveys lymph in the body. <i><b>Lymphatic</b> vessels.</i>
<b>oxygenation</b>	The process of providing or combining or treating with oxygen. <i>The <b>oxygenation</b> of the blood.</i>
<b>plasma</b>	Physical chemistry a fourth state of matter distinct from solid or liquid or gas and present in stars and fusion reactors a gas becomes a plasma when it is heated until the atoms lose all their electrons leaving a highly electrified collection of nuclei and free electrons. <i><b>Plasma</b> physics.</i>
<b>portal</b>	A grand and imposing entrance (often extended metaphorically). <i>Many healthcare providers already utilize <b>portals</b> through which a patient can access test results.</i>
<b>primogenitor</b>	An ancestor, especially the earliest ancestor of a people; a progenitor.
<b>pulmonary</b>	Relating to the lungs. <i><b>Pulmonary</b> disease.</i>
<b>sepsis</b>	The presence of pus-forming bacteria or their toxins in the blood or tissues.
<b>vein</b>	Make a veinlike pattern. <i>He felt the adrenaline course through his <b>veins</b>.</i>
