Associations of "S for purple" (30 Words)

achromatic	Relating to, using, or denoting lenses that transmit light without separating it into constituent colours. <i>The achromatic gloom.</i>
blue	Blue colour or pigment. <i>They blued the shirts and starched the uniforms.</i>
brownish	Of a color similar to that of wood or earth. <i>A brownish coloured cat.</i>
carmine	Color carmine. <i>Carmine roses.</i>
color	Decorate with colors. <i>Color film.</i>
colored	(used of color) artificially produced; not natural. <i>Amber colored heads of grain.</i>
crimson	Of a color at the end of the color spectrum (next to orange); resembling the color of blood or cherries or tomatoes or rubies. <i>Flushed or crimson with embarrassment.</i>
ebony	Hard dark colored heartwood of the ebony tree used in cabinetwork and for piano keys. <i>His smile flashed against the ebony of his skin.</i>
flushed	Having the pinkish flush of health. <i>Her flushed cheeks.</i>
gray	The SI unit of energy absorbed from ionizing radiation equal to the absorption of one joule of radiation energy by one kilogram of matter one gray equals 100 rad. <i>Gray flannel suit.</i>
hue	A colour or shade. <i>The water is the deepest hue of aquamarine.</i>

imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
magenta	A primary subtractive color for light a dark purple red color the dye for magenta was discovered in 1859 the year of the battle of Magenta. <i>A short magenta dress.</i>
maroon	Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue. <i>The mutinous sailors were marooned on an island.</i>
mauve	Of a pale purple colour. <i>A few pale streaks of mauve were all that remained of the sunset.</i>
negligee	A woman's light dressing gown, typically made of a filmy, soft fabric. <i>A black silk negligee.</i>
<u>painted</u>	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i>The painted desert.</i>
pigmentation	The natural colouring of animal or plant tissue.
pimpernel	A small European plant of the primrose family, with creeping stems and flat five-petalled flowers.
<u>pink</u>	Pink colour pigment or material. <i>A boom in the pink economy.</i>
red	Especially of the face reddened or suffused with or as if with blood from emotion or exertion. <i>The company was 4 million in the red.</i>
<u>rose</u>	The flower of a rose bush. <i>The roseate glow of dawn.</i>
roseate	Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern. <i>The roseate glow of dawn.</i>
rosy	Presaging good fortune. <i>Life could never be rosy for them.</i>
ruddy	Make ruddy in colour. <i>Young people today they re a ruddy shower.</i>
<u>scarlet</u>	Scarlet clothes or material. <i>A mass of scarlet berries.</i>
strawberry	The low growing plant which produces the strawberry having white flowers lobed leaves and runners and found throughout north temperate regions. <i>She thought she would wear the strawberry crushed velvet.</i>
tulip	Any of numerous perennial bulbous herbs having linear or broadly lanceolate leaves and usually a single showy flower.

white

Of wine made from white grapes or dark grapes with the skins removed and having a yellowish colour.

*Under segregation there were even **white** restrooms and **white** drinking fountains.*

yellow

Any of a number of plant diseases in which the leaves turn yellow typically caused by viruses and transmitted by insects.

*Curly **yellow** hair.*
