Associations of "Sacrificed" (30 Words)

altar	A table or flat-topped block used as the focus for a religious ritual, especially for making sacrifices or offerings to a deity.
chalice	A large cup or goblet.
confessional	Relating to confessions of faith or doctrinal systems. <i>The priest leaned forward in his best confessional manner.</i>
consecrate	Give entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause. <i>The consecrated chapel.</i>
<u>consign</u>	Commit forever; commit irrevocably. <i>Consign your baggage.</i>
dedicate	Open to public use, as of a highway, park, or building. <i>Volume four is dedicated to wasps.</i>
dedicated	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high or sacred purpose. <i>A dedicated dancer.</i>
<u>dedication</u>	The quality of being dedicated or committed to a task or purpose. <i>A faintly engraved inscription or dedication.</i>
<u>devotion</u>	Prayers or religious observances. <i>She was the epitome of wifely devotion.</i>
<u>give</u>	Give as a present make a gift of. <i>I hope I don t give you my cold.</i>
goblet	A drinking glass with a base and stem. <i>A beautifully engraved crystal goblet.</i>
holy	Used in exclamations of surprise or dismay. <i>Holy smoke.</i>
lectern	Desk or stand with a slanted top used to hold a text at the proper height for a lecturer.
lecture	Deliver an educational lecture or lectures. <i>He attended a lecture on telecommunications.</i>

loss	Gradual decline in amount or activity. <i>Funding cuts will lead to job losses.</i>
oblation	The presentation of bread and wine to God in the Eucharist. <i>Oblations for aid to the poor.</i>
offering	The verbal act of offering. <i>Noteworthy new offerings for investors included several index funds.</i>
orison	Reverent petition to a deity.
podium	Of a competitor in a sporting event finish first second or third so as to appear on a podium to receive an award. <i>I took the score out of my briefcase and put it on the podium.</i>
prayer	A solemn request for help or expression of thanks addressed to God or another deity. <i>I ll say a prayer for him.</i>
propitiatory	Intended to reconcile or appease. <i>Expiatory or propitiatory sacrifice.</i>
pulpit	Religious teaching as expressed in sermons. <i>The movies could rival the pulpit as an agency moulding the ideas of the mass public.</i>
religion	The belief in and worship of a superhuman controlling power, especially a personal God or gods. <i>The world s great religions.</i>
reliquary	A container where religious relics are stored or displayed (especially relics of saints).
requiem	A musical composition setting parts of a requiem Mass or of a similar character. <i>A requiem was held for the dead queen.</i>
sacrificial	Designed to be used up or destroyed in fulfilling a purpose or function. <i>An altar for sacrificial offerings.</i>
tithe	Pay or give as a tithe. <i>He hadn t said a tithe of the prayers he knew.</i>
votive	Dedicated in fulfillment of a vow. <i>Votive offerings.</i>
willing	Disposed or inclined toward. <i>Willing helpers.</i>
