<u>inalienable</u>	Incapable of being repudiated or transferred to another. The shareholders have the <b>inalienable</b> right to dismiss directors.
inviolable	Must be kept sacred. <i>The person of the king is <b>inviolable</b>.</i>
inviolate	(of a woman) having the hymen unbroken. An international memorial which must remain <b>inviolate</b> .
invulnerable	Immune to attack; impregnable. Gunners raked the beach from <b>invulnerable</b> positions on the cliffs.
protected	(of a threatened species or area) covered by legislation controlling hunting, collection, or development. <i>Medical facilities have a special protected status under international</i> <i>law.</i>



respected	Deeply admired or esteemed. A <b>respected</b> academic.
sacred	Worthy of religious veneration. A <b>sacred</b> Hindu text.
safe	Financially safe. His world it s <b>safe</b> to say will not fall apart.
<u>secure</u>	Immune to attack; incapable of being tampered with. A <b>secure</b> investment.
set apart	Converted to solid form (as concrete.
unchallengeable	Not open to challenge. <b>Unchallengeable</b> facts.
unimpeachable	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. An <b>unimpeachable</b> reputation.
unthreatened	Free from threat or danger; safe and secure. Her lead remained <b>unthreatened</b> for the remainder of the race.
<u>untouchable</u>	Defiling. In most museums such articles are <b>untouchable</b> .

hallowed	Greatly revered and honoured. The band will be in some <b>hallowed</b> and historic surroundings.
<b>heavenly</b>	Relating to or inhabiting a divine heaven. <i>Heavenly</i> Father.
<u>heresy</u>	Opinion profoundly at odds with what is generally accepted. <i>The doctrine was denounced as a <b>heresy</b> by the Pope.</i>
holy	(of a person) devoted to the service of God. <i>Holy</i> smoke.
<u>invincible</u>	Incapable of being overcome or subdued. An <i>invincible</i> warrior.
inviolable	Immune to attack; incapable of being tampered with. An <b>inviolable</b> oath.
inviolate	Must be kept sacred. An international memorial which must remain <b>inviolate</b> .
liturgy	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. A tradition which found its expression in ritual and <b>liturgy</b> .
omniscience	The state of being omniscient; having infinite knowledge. <i>The notion of divine <b>omniscience</b></i> .
orison	A prayer.
pantheon	All the gods of a people or religion collectively. <i>The <b>pantheon</b> of the all time greats.</i>
priestess	A female priest of a non-Christian religion.
religion	The belief in and worship of a superhuman controlling power, especially a personal God or gods. Ideas about the relationship between science and <b>religion</b> .
religious	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience. <i>A member of a <b>religious</b> order.</i>
sacred	Concerned with religion or religious purposes. A profit oriented public to whom nothing is <b>sacred</b> .



sacrilege	Blasphemous behavior; the act of depriving something of its sacred character. Putting ecclesiastical vestments to secular use was considered <b>sacrilege</b> .
<u>sanctity</u>	The state or quality of being holy, sacred, or saintly. The site of the tomb was a place of <b>sanctity</b> for the ancient Egyptians.
theologian	Someone who is learned in theology or who speculates about theology.
theological	Relating to the study of the nature of God and religious belief. <i>Theological</i> and pastoral training.
theology	Religious beliefs and theory when systematically developed. <i>Jewish theology</i> .
