hallowed	Worthy of religious veneration. <i>Hallowed</i> ground.
<u>inalienable</u>	Incapable of being repudiated or transferred to another. The shareholders have the inalienable right to dismiss directors.
inviolable	Must be kept sacred. <i>The person of the king is inviolable.</i>
inviolate	(of a woman) having the hymen unbroken. An international memorial which must remain inviolate .
invulnerable	Immune to attack; impregnable. Gunners raked the beach from invulnerable positions on the cliffs.
protected	(of a threatened species or area) covered by legislation controlling hunting, collection, or development. <i>Medical facilities have a special protected status under international</i> <i>law.</i>



respected	Deeply admired or esteemed. A respected academic.
sacred	Worthy of religious veneration. A sacred Hindu text.
safe	Financially safe. His world it s safe to say will not fall apart.
<u>secure</u>	Immune to attack; incapable of being tampered with. A secure investment.
set apart	Converted to solid form (as concrete.
unchallengeable	Not open to challenge. Unchallengeable facts.
unimpeachable	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. An unimpeachable reputation.
unthreatened	Free from threat or danger; safe and secure. Her lead remained unthreatened for the remainder of the race.
<u>untouchable</u>	Defiling. In most museums such articles are untouchable .

ecumenism	The principle or aim of promoting unity among the world's Christian Churches.
enshrine	Enclose in a shrine. The saint s bones were enshrine d in the cathedral.
hallowed	Greatly revered and honoured. The band will be in some hallowed and historic surroundings.
heavenly	Relating to or inhabiting a divine heaven. <i>Heavenly</i> Father.
<u>heresy</u>	Opinion profoundly at odds with what is generally accepted. <i>The doctrine was denounced as a heresy by the Pope.</i>
holy	(of a person) devoted to the service of God. <i>Holy</i> smoke.
<u>invincible</u>	Incapable of being overcome or subdued. An <i>invincible</i> warrior.
inviolable	Immune to attack; incapable of being tampered with. An inviolable oath.
inviolate	Must be kept sacred. An international memorial which must remain inviolate .
liturgy	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. A tradition which found its expression in ritual and liturgy .
omniscience	The state of being omniscient; having infinite knowledge. <i>The notion of divine omniscience</i> .
orison	A prayer.
pantheon	All the gods of a people or religion collectively. <i>The pantheon of the all time greats.</i>
priestess	A female priest of a non-Christian religion.
religion	The belief in and worship of a superhuman controlling power, especially a personal God or gods. Ideas about the relationship between science and religion .
religious	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience. <i>A member of a religious order.</i>
sacred	Concerned with religion or religious purposes. A profit oriented public to whom nothing is sacred .



sacrilege	Blasphemous behavior; the act of depriving something of its sacred character. Putting ecclesiastical vestments to secular use was considered sacrilege .
<u>sanctity</u>	The state or quality of being holy, sacred, or saintly. The site of the tomb was a place of sanctity for the ancient Egyptians.
theologian	Someone who is learned in theology or who speculates about theology.
theological	Relating to the study of the nature of God and religious belief. <i>Theological</i> and pastoral training.
theology	Religious beliefs and theory when systematically developed. <i>Jewish theology</i> .
