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## Associations of "Safer" (30 Words)

<b>comforted</b>	Made comfortable or more comfortable in a time of distress. <i>The news make her feel <b>comforted</b>.</i>
<b>defence</b>	(psychiatry) an unconscious process that tries to reduce the anxiety associated with instinctive desires. <i>His first title <b>defence</b> against Jones.</i>
<b>defensible</b>	Capable of being defended. <i>A fort with a <b>defensible</b> yard at its feet.</i>
<b><u>durable</u></b>	Capable of withstanding wear and tear and decay. <i>The <b>durable</b> Smith lasted the full eight rounds.</i>
<b>evacuation</b>	The bodily process of discharging waste matter. <i>Those who required an <b>evacuation</b> of retained products.</i>
<b>fireproof</b>	Make something fireproof. <i>Nearby museum buildings will be <b>fireproofed</b>.</i>
<b><u>harmless</u></b>	Not able or likely to cause harm. <i>As an entertainer he s pretty <b>harmless</b>.</i>
<b>helmet</b>	The arched upper part (galea) of the corolla in some flowers, especially those of the mint and orchid families.
<b>innocuous</b>	Not harmful or offensive. <i>It was an <b>innocuous</b> question.</i>
<b>intact</b>	Not damaged or impaired in any way; complete. <i>Fought to keep the union <b>intact</b>.</i>
<b>invulnerable</b>	Impossible to harm or damage. <i>No state in the region is now <b>invulnerable</b> to attack by another.</i>
<b>lancet</b>	Shaped like a lancet arch. <i>A <b>lancet</b> clock.</i>
<b>preclusive</b>	Preventing something from happening; restrictive. <i>Grounds for <b>preclusive</b> intervention.</i>

<b><u>preemptive</u></b>	Designed or having the power to deter or prevent an anticipated situation or occurrence. <i>A <b>preemptive</b> business offer.</i>
<b>prophylactic</b>	Capable of preventing conception or impregnation. <i><b>Prophylactic</b> measures.</i>
<b>protecting</b>	Shielding (or designed to shield) against harm or discomfort. <i>The <b>protecting</b> blanket of snow.</i>
<b><u>protective</u></b>	Intended to protect someone or something. <i>A <b>protective</b> mother.</i>
<b>relieved</b>	Made easier to bear. <i><b>Relieved</b> parents who had waited anxiously for news.</i>
<b>safety</b>	The state of being certain that adverse effects will not be caused by some agent under defined conditions. <i>Insure the <b>safety</b> of the children.</i>
<b><u>secure</u></b>	Financially safe. <i>Everyone needs to have a home and to feel <b>secure</b> and wanted.</i>
<b><u>security</u></b>	A department responsible for the security of the institution s property and workers. <i>Amid tight <b>security</b> the presidents met in the Colombian resort.</i>
<b><u>sober</u></b>	Make or become sober after drinking alcohol. <i>I ought to <b>sober</b> up a bit.</i>
<b>sobriety</b>	The state of being sober and not intoxicated by alcohol. <i>She speaks with such <b>sobriety</b> it s clear she speaks the truth.</i>
<b>undamaged</b>	Not harmed or spoiled; sound. <i>Buildings <b>undamaged</b> during the war.</i>
<b>unharméd</b>	Not injured or harmed. <i>All the hostages were released <b>unharméd</b>.</i>
<b>unhurt</b>	Free from danger or injury. <i>He was shaken but <b>unhurt</b> after being pelted with cans and bottles.</i>
<b>unimpaired</b>	Not damaged or diminished in any respect. <i>His speech remained <b>unimpaired</b>.</i>
<b>uninjured</b>	Not injured physically or mentally. <i>They escaped <b>uninjured</b> when their homes were hit.</i>
<b>unscathed</b>	Not injured or harmed. <i>I came through all those perils <b>unscathed</b>.</i>
