comforted	Made comfortable or more comfortable in a time of distress. <i>The news make her feel comforted.</i>
defence	(psychiatry) an unconscious process that tries to reduce the anxiety associated with instinctive desires. <i>His first title defence against Jones.</i>
defensible	Capable of being defended. <i>A fort with a defensible yard at its feet.</i>
<u>durable</u>	Capable of withstanding wear and tear and decay. <i>The durable Smith lasted the full eight rounds.</i>
evacuation	The bodily process of discharging waste matter. <i>Those who required an evacuation of retained products.</i>
fireproof	Make something fireproof. <i>Nearby museum buildings will be fireproofed.</i>
<u>harmless</u>	Not able or likely to cause harm. <i>As an entertainer he s pretty harmless.</i>
helmet	The arched upper part (galea) of the corolla in some flowers, especially those of the mint and orchid families.
innocuous	Not harmful or offensive. <i>It was an innocuous question.</i>
intact	Not damaged or impaired in any way; complete. <i>Fought to keep the union intact.</i>
invulnerable	Impossible to harm or damage. <i>No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.</i>
lancet	Shaped like a lancet arch. <i>A lancet clock.</i>
preclusive	Preventing something from happening; restrictive. <i>Grounds for preclusive intervention.</i>

preemptive	Designed or having the power to deter or prevent an anticipated situation or occurrence. <i>A preemptive business offer.</i>
prophylactic	Capable of preventing conception or impregnation. <i>Prophylactic measures.</i>
protecting	Shielding (or designed to shield) against harm or discomfort. <i>The protecting blanket of snow.</i>
protective	Intended to protect someone or something. <i>A protective mother.</i>
relieved	Made easier to bear. <i>Relieved parents who had waited anxiously for news.</i>
safety	The state of being certain that adverse effects will not be caused by some agent under defined conditions. <i>Insure the safety of the children.</i>
secure	Financially safe. <i>Everyone needs to have a home and to feel secure and wanted.</i>
security	A department responsible for the security of the institution s property and workers. <i>Amid tight security the presidents met in the Colombian resort.</i>
sober	Make or become sober after drinking alcohol. <i>I ought to sober up a bit.</i>
sobriety	The state of being sober and not intoxicated by alcohol. <i>She speaks with such sobriety it s clear she speaks the truth.</i>
undamaged	Not harmed or spoiled; sound. <i>Buildings undamaged during the war.</i>
unharméd	Not injured or harmed. <i>All the hostages were released unharméd.</i>
unhurt	Free from danger or injury. <i>He was shaken but unhurt after being pelted with cans and bottles.</i>
unimpaired	Not damaged or diminished in any respect. <i>His speech remained unimpaired.</i>
uninjured	Not injured physically or mentally. <i>They escaped uninjured when their homes were hit.</i>
unscathed	Not injured or harmed. <i>I came through all those perils unscathed.</i>
