- *A man whose job involves selling or promoting commercial products, either in a shop or visiting locations to get orders.*
- *A man salesperson.*



## Synonyms of "Salesman" as a noun (11 Words)

<b>checkout girl</b>	A friendly informal reference to a grown woman.
<b>checkout operator</b>	An agent that operates some apparatus or machine.
<b>checkout person</b>	A human body (usually including the clothing).
<b>retail assistant</b>	The selling of goods to consumers; usually in small quantities and not for resale.
<b>sales assistant</b>	Income (at invoice values) received for goods and services over some given period of time.
<b>salesgirl</b>	A woman salesperson.
<b>saleslady</b>	A woman salesperson.
<b>salesperson</b>	A person employed to represent a business and to sell its merchandise (as to customers in a store or to customers who are visited).

**saleswoman** A woman salesperson.  
*A **saleswoman** came out from behind the counter and asked if she could help.*

**server** A person assisting the celebrant at the celebration of the Eucharist.  
*The software runs on a variety of Unix **servers**.*

**shop assistant** A course of instruction in a trade (as carpentry or electricity).

## Associations of "Salesman" (30 Words)

<b>advertiser</b>	A person or company that advertises a product, service, or event. <i>Kids hate it when <b>advertisers</b> try too hard to target them on their level.</i>
<b>automat</b>	A cafeteria in which food and drink were obtained from slot machines.
<b>buyer</b>	A person who makes a purchase.
<b>clerk</b>	Work as a clerk as in the legal business. <i>She approached the desk and the <b>clerk</b> looked down at her.</i>
<b>commerce</b>	Transactions (sales and purchases) having the objective of supplying commodities (goods and services). <i>The changes in taxation are of benefit to <b>commerce</b>.</i>
<b>employee</b>	A person employed for wages or salary, especially at non-executive level.
<b>fishmonger</b>	A person or shop that sells fish for food.
<b>huckster</b>	A person who sells in an aggressive or ruthless way. <i>A door to door <b>huckster</b>.</i>

<b>market</b>	The free market. <i>Then I have to go uptown and <b>market</b>.</i>
<b>marketer</b>	A person or company that advertises or promotes something. <i>A leading manufacturer and <b>marketer</b> of medical products.</i>
<b>marketplace</b>	An open space where a market is or was formerly held. <i>The quaint cobbled <b>marketplace</b>.</i>
<b>merchant</b>	In historical contexts relating to merchants or commerce. <i>Prosperous <b>merchants</b> and clothiers had established a middle class.</i>
<b>outsell</b>	Sell or be sold in greater quantities than. <i>This salesman <b>outsells</b> his colleagues.</i>
<b>peddle</b>	Try to sell (something, especially small goods) by going from place to place. <i>He was arrested after trying to <b>peddle</b> guns.</i>
<b>purchaser</b>	A person who buys something; a buyer. <i>One of the club's prospective <b>purchasers</b>.</i>
<b>salesclerk</b>	A salesperson in a store.
<b>salesperson</b>	A person employed to represent a business and to sell its merchandise (as to customers in a store or to customers who are visited).
<b>sell</b>	An act of selling or attempting to sell something. <i>Do not your lawyers <b>sell</b> all their practice as your priests their prayers.</i>
<b>seller</b>	A person who sells something. <i>The book became the biggest <b>seller</b> in the history of royal publishing.</i>
<b>selling</b>	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money.
<b>shopkeeper</b>	A merchant who owns or manages a shop.
<b>store</b>	A shop of any size or kind. <i>DIY <b>stores</b>.</i>
<b>subcontractor</b>	Someone who enters into a subcontract with the primary contractor.
<b>trader</b>	A merchant ship.
<b>transact</b>	Conduct or carry out (business). <i>The dealer must know the price at which he is prepared to <b>transact</b>.</i>
<b>undersell</b>	Sell cheaper than one's competition. <i>We can equal or <b>undersell</b> mail order.</i>
<b>vend</b>	Sell (something). <i>There was a man <b>vending</b> sticky cakes and ices.</i>
<b>vendor</b>	A person or company offering something for sale, especially a trader in the street. <i>An Italian ice cream <b>vendor</b>.</i>

**vintner** A producer of wine; a winegrower.

**wholesale** At a wholesale price.  
**Wholesale** destruction.
