- *A man whose job involves selling or promoting commercial products, either in a shop or visiting locations to get orders.*
- *A man salesperson.*



Synonyms of "Salesman" as a noun (11 Words)

checkout girl	A friendly informal reference to a grown woman.
checkout operator	An agent that operates some apparatus or machine.
checkout person	A human body (usually including the clothing).
retail assistant	The selling of goods to consumers; usually in small quantities and not for resale.
sales assistant	Income (at invoice values) received for goods and services over some given period of time.
salesgirl	A woman salesperson.
saleslady	A woman salesperson.
salesperson	A person employed to represent a business and to sell its merchandise (as to customers in a store or to customers who are visited).

saleswoman A woman salesperson.
*A **saleswoman** came out from behind the counter and asked if she could help.*

server A person assisting the celebrant at the celebration of the Eucharist.
*The software runs on a variety of Unix **servers**.*

shop assistant A course of instruction in a trade (as carpentry or electricity).

- *An insurance salesman.*



Associations of "Salesman" (30 Words)

advertiser	A person or company that advertises a product, service, or event. <i>Kids hate it when advertisers try too hard to target them on their level.</i>
automat	A cafeteria in which food and drink were obtained from slot machines.
buyer	A person who makes a purchase.
clerk	Work as a clerk as in the legal business. <i>She approached the desk and the clerk looked down at her.</i>
commerce	Transactions (sales and purchases) having the objective of supplying commodities (goods and services). <i>The changes in taxation are of benefit to commerce.</i>
employee	A person employed for wages or salary, especially at non-executive level.
fishmonger	A person or shop that sells fish for food.
huckster	A person who sells in an aggressive or ruthless way. <i>A door to door huckster.</i>

market	The free market. <i>Then I have to go uptown and market.</i>
marketer	A person or company that advertises or promotes something. <i>A leading manufacturer and marketer of medical products.</i>
marketplace	An open space where a market is or was formerly held. <i>The quaint cobbled marketplace.</i>
merchant	In historical contexts relating to merchants or commerce. <i>Prosperous merchants and clothiers had established a middle class.</i>
outsell	Sell or be sold in greater quantities than. <i>This salesman outsells his colleagues.</i>
peddle	Try to sell (something, especially small goods) by going from place to place. <i>He was arrested after trying to peddle guns.</i>
purchaser	A person who buys something; a buyer. <i>One of the club's prospective purchasers.</i>
salesclerk	A salesperson in a store.
salesperson	A person employed to represent a business and to sell its merchandise (as to customers in a store or to customers who are visited).
sell	An act of selling or attempting to sell something. <i>Do not your lawyers sell all their practice as your priests their prayers.</i>
seller	A person who sells something. <i>The book became the biggest seller in the history of royal publishing.</i>
selling	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money.
shopkeeper	A merchant who owns or manages a shop.
store	A shop of any size or kind. <i>DIY stores.</i>
subcontractor	Someone who enters into a subcontract with the primary contractor.
trader	A merchant ship.
transact	Conduct or carry out (business). <i>The dealer must know the price at which he is prepared to transact.</i>
undersell	Sell cheaper than one's competition. <i>We can equal or undersell mail order.</i>
vend	Sell (something). <i>There was a man vending sticky cakes and ices.</i>
vendor	A person or company offering something for sale, especially a trader in the street. <i>An Italian ice cream vendor.</i>

vintner A producer of wine; a winegrower.

wholesale At a wholesale price.
Wholesale destruction.
