## Salvation as a Noun

### Definitions of "Salvation" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “salvation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Deliverance from sin and its consequences, believed by Christians to be brought about by faith in Christ.*
- *A means of preserving from harm or unpleasantness.*
- *A source or means of being saved from harm, ruin, or loss.*
- *The state of being saved or preserved from harm.*
- *Saving someone or something from harm or from an unpleasant situation.*
- *Preservation or deliverance from harm, ruin, or loss.*
- *The act of delivering from sin or saving from evil.*
- *(theology) the act of delivering from sin or saving from evil.*



## Synonyms of "Salvation" as a noun (9 Words)

<b>conservation</b>	The maintenance of a certain quantities unchanged during chemical reactions or physical transformations. <i>The government must take action to promote energy <b>conservation</b>.</i>
<b><u>deliverance</u></b>	Recovery or preservation from loss or danger. <i>The low drawl he employed for such <b>deliverances</b>.</i>
<b>help</b>	The action of helping someone to do something. <i>Offered his <b>help</b> in unloading.</i>
<b>lifeline</b>	A thing on which someone or something depends or which provides a means of escape from a difficult situation. <i>Fertility treatment can seem like a <b>lifeline</b> to childless couples.</i>
<b>means of escape</b>	An instrumentality for accomplishing some end.
<b>preservation</b>	The activity of protecting something from loss or danger. <i>The <b>preservation</b> of the city's green spaces.</i>

- reclamation** The process of claiming something back or of reasserting a right.  
*A land **reclamation** project.*
- redemption** The action of regaining or gaining possession of something in exchange for payment, or clearing a debt.  
*Soldiers who were captured had to seek **redemption**.*
- saving** The activity of protecting something from loss or danger.  
*The agents were cheating them out of their life **savings**.*



### Usage Examples of "Salvation" as a noun

- *Tourism was their economic salvation.*
- *The Christian gospel of salvation for all mankind.*
- *The salvation of his party was the president's major concern.*
- *His only salvation was to outfly the enemy.*
- *They try to sell it to us as economic salvation.*
- *They turned to individualism as their salvation.*



## Associations of "Salvation" (30 Words)

- apologetic** Offering or expressing apology.  
*An **apologetic** smile.*
- atonement** The action of making amends for a wrong or injury.  
*He submitted his resignation as an act of **atonement**.*
- baptism** A ceremony or occasion at which baptism takes place.  
*The sacrament of **baptism**.*
- compunction** A feeling of deep regret (usually for some misdeed).  
*They used their tanks without **compunction**.*
- confess** Confess to a punishable or reprehensible deed usually under pressure.  
*I could not **confess** all my sins to the priest.*

<b><u>confession</u></b>	The religious body or Church sharing a confession of faith. <i>His words are a political <b>confession</b> of faith.</i>
<b>confessor</b>	A person to whom another confides personal problems. <i>If one prisoner confesses and implicates the other the <b>confessor</b> will go free as a reward.</i>
<b>contrite</b>	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. <i>A <b>contrite</b> tone.</i>
<b>contrition</b>	(in the Roman Catholic Church) the repentance of past sins during or after confession. <i>Prayers of <b>contrition</b>.</i>
<b><u>faith</u></b>	Complete trust or confidence in someone or something. <i>A member of his own <b>faith</b> contradicted him.</i>
<b>forgive</b>	Stop blaming or grant forgiveness. <i>I <b>forgive</b> you your debt.</i>
<b>mormon</b>	A member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.
<b>penance</b>	Impose a penance on. <i>He had done public <b>penance</b> for those hasty words.</i>
<b>penitence</b>	The action of feeling or showing sorrow and regret for having done wrong; repentance. <i>A public display of <b>penitence</b>.</i>
<b>penitent</b>	(in the Roman Catholic Church) a person who confesses their sins to a priest and submits to the penance that he imposes. <i>A <b>penitent</b> expression.</i>
<b><u>redemption</u></b>	A thing that saves someone from error or evil. <i>Soldiers who were captured had to seek <b>redemption</b>.</i>
<b>regret</b>	Express with regret. <i>I <b>regret</b> I can't come to the party.</i>
<b>regretful</b>	Feeling or showing regret. <i>He sounded <b>regretful</b> but pointed out that he had committed himself.</i>
<b><u>remorse</u></b>	Deep regret or guilt for a wrong committed. <i>They were filled with <b>remorse</b> and shame.</i>
<b>remorseful</b>	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. <i>The defendant was <b>remorseful</b> for what he had done.</i>
<b>repent</b>	Turn away from sin or do penitence. <i>Marian came to <b>repent</b> her hasty judgement.</i>

<b><u>repentance</u></b>	The action of repenting; sincere regret or remorse. <i>Each person who turns to God in genuine <b>repentance</b> and faith will be saved.</i>
<b>repentant</b>	Expressing or feeling sincere regret and remorse; remorseful. <i>He is truly <b>repentant</b> for his incredible naivety and stupidity.</i>
<b>rescue</b>	Keep from being lost or abandoned; retrieve. <i>He came to our <b>rescue</b> with a loan of 100.</i>
<b>rue</b>	Bitterly regret (something one has done or allowed to happen) and wish it undone. <i>With <b>rue</b> my heart is laden.</i>
<b><u>rueful</u></b>	Feeling or expressing pain or sorrow for sins or offenses. <i>She gave a <b>rueful</b> grin.</i>
<b>sacrament</b>	A formal religious ceremony conferring a specific grace on those who receive it; the two Protestant ceremonies are baptism and the Lord's Supper; in the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church there are seven traditional rites accepted as instituted by Jesus: baptism and confirmation and Holy Eucharist and penance and holy orders and matrimony and extreme unction. <i>He heard Mass and received the <b>sacrament</b>.</i>
<b>scruple</b>	Raise scruples. <i>Without <b>scruple</b> politicians use fear as a persuasion weapon.</i>
<b><u>sin</u></b>	Commit a sin. <i>I <b>sinned</b> and brought shame down on us.</i>
<b><u>sinner</u></b>	A person who transgresses against divine law by committing an immoral act or acts. <i>God forgives repentant <b>sinner</b>s.</i>
