- *The quality of being the same; identity or similarity.*



## Synonyms of "Sameness" as a noun (24 Words)

<b>alikeness</b>	The quality or fact of being alike; resemblance, similarity.
<b><u>closeness</u></b>	The quality of affection or intimacy in a relationship. <i>The <b>closeness</b> with which he watched current events.</i>
<b>comparability</b>	Qualities that are comparable. <i>There are differences in hospital recording practices that will affect the <b>comparability</b> of results.</i>
<b>congruence</b>	Agreement or harmony; compatibility. <i>The results show quite good <b>congruence</b> with recent studies.</i>
<b>congruity</b>	The quality of agreeing; being suitable and appropriate.
<b><u>consistency</u></b>	The quality of achieving a level of performance which does not vary greatly in quality over time. <i>We know we have the ability at the club what we need is <b>consistency</b>.</i>

<u><b>correspondence</b></u>	<p>An attribute of a shape or relation; exact reflection of form on opposite sides of a dividing line or plane.  <i>The organization engaged in detailed <b>correspondence</b> with local MPs.</i></p>
<b>equality</b>	<p>A symbolic expression of the fact that two quantities are equal; an equation.  <i>An organization aiming to promote racial <b>equality</b>.</i></p>
<b>equivalence</b>	<p>The condition of being equal or equivalent in value, worth, function, etc.  <i>Precise <b>equivalences</b> between qualifications across Europe.</i></p>
<b>humdrum</b>	<p>The quality of wearisome constancy, routine, and lack of variety.  <i>He was sick of the <b>humdrum</b> of his fellow prisoners.</i></p>
<b>identicalness</b>	<p>The quality of being identical; sameness; identity.</p>
<b>identity</b>	<p>An element of a set which, if combined with another element by a specified binary operation, leaves that element unchanged.  <i>She guessed the <b>identity</b> of his lover.</i></p>
<b>indistinguishability</b>	<p>Exact sameness.</p>
<b>interchangeability</b>	<p>The quality of being capable of exchange or interchange.</p>
<b>likeness</b>	<p>The semblance, guise, or outward appearance of.  <i>Her <b>likeness</b> to him was astonishing.</i></p>
<u><b>monotony</b></u>	<p>Constancy of tone or pitch or inflection.  <i>Depression flattens the voice almost to <b>monotony</b>.</i></p>
<b>oneness</b>	<p>The quality of being united into one.  <i>A strong sense of <b>oneness</b> is felt with all things.</i></p>
<b>parallelism</b>	<p>The use of successive verbal constructions in poetry or prose which correspond in grammatical structure, sound, metre, meaning, etc.  <i>The <b>parallelisms</b> are reinforced by frequent alliteration.</i></p>
<b>parity</b>	<p>Computer science a bit that is used in an error detection procedure in which a 0 or 1 is added to each group of bits so that it will have either an odd number of 1 s or an even number of 1 s e g if the parity is odd then any group of bits that arrives with an even number of 1 s must contain an error.  <i>The <b>parity</b> of the mother must be considered.</i></p>
<u><b>resemblance</b></u>	<p>A way in which two or more things are alike.  <i>They bear some <b>resemblance</b> to Italian figurines.</i></p>
<b>selfsameness</b>	<p>The quality of being identical with itself.</p>
<b>similarity</b>	<p>A similar feature or aspect.  <i>The <b>similarity</b> of symptoms makes them hard to diagnose.</i></p>

**similitude**

The quality or state of being similar to something.  
*Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply **similitude**.*

**uniformity**

A condition in which everything is regular and unvarying.  
*An attempt to impose administrative and cultural **uniformity**.*
