blessedness	The state of being blessed with divine favour.
devotion	Feelings of ardent love. <i>The order's aim was to live a life of devotion.</i>
devoutness	Water that has condensed on a cool surface overnight from water vapor in the air.
godliness	The quality of being devoutly religious; piety. <i>A man of great godliness.</i>
goodness	That which is pleasing or valuable or useful. <i>A belief in the basic goodness of mankind.</i>

holiness	Denoting a Christian renewal movement originating in the mid 19th century among Methodists in the US, emphasizing the Wesleyan doctrine of the sanctification of believers. <i>A life of holiness and total devotion to God.</i>
piety	The quality of being religious or reverent. <i>Acts of piety and charity.</i>
piousness	Righteousness by virtue of being pious.
purity	Freedom from immorality, especially of a sexual nature. <i>The purity of our drinking water.</i>
righteousness	The quality of being morally right or justifiable. <i>We had little doubt about the righteousness of our cause.</i>
sacredness	The quality of being sacred.
saintliness	The quality or state of being saintly; holiness. <i>Her selfless behaviour borders on saintliness.</i>
sanctitude	The quality of being holy.
spirituality	Property or income owned by a church. <i>The shift in priorities allows us to embrace our spirituality in a more profound way.</i>
ultimate importance	The finest or most superior quality of its kind.
virtue	Virginity or chastity, especially of a woman. <i>Mike was extolling the virtues of the car.</i>
virtuousness	The quality of doing what is right and avoiding what is wrong.

blaspheme	Speak irreverently about God or sacred things. <i>Blaspheme God.</i>

<u>bless</u>	Pronounce words in a religious rite in order to confer or invoke divine favour upon; ask God to look favourably on. <i>A beautiful city blessed with huge sandy beaches.</i>
blessed	Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration. <i>He half stumbled out of the room up to his bed and blessed blessed sleep.</i> (in Christian belief) declare (bread and wine) to be or represent the body and
consecrate	blood of Christ. <i>A life consecrated to science.</i>
dedicated	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose. <i>A dedicated dancer.</i>
<u>devout</u>	Totally committed to a cause or belief. <i>A rabbi s devout prayers.</i>
<u>divine</u>	Resulting from divine providence. <i>The divine strength of Achilles.</i>
<u>divinity</u>	The study of religion; theology. <i>Ancient Egyptians believed in the divinity of the Pharaohs.</i>
godly	Emanating from God. <i>Everything is black or white satanic or godly.</i>
hallowed	Greatly revered and honoured. <i>The hallowed turf of Wimbledon.</i>
<u>heresy</u>	A belief that rejects the orthodox tenets of a religion. <i>The heresy of being uncommitted to the right political dogma.</i>
holy	A sacred place of pilgrimage. <i>I do not lead a holy life.</i>
liturgy	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>At the conclusion of the liturgy the Bishop presented the certificates.</i>
oblation	The act of offering the bread and wine of the Eucharist. <i>Oblations for aid to the poor.</i>
orison	A prayer.
pharisaic	Excessively or hypocritically pious.
piety	The quality of being religious or reverent. <i>Acts of piety and charity.</i>
<u>pilgrimage</u>	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>Thousands pilgrimage there every year.</i>
<u>pious</u>	Having or showing or expressing reverence for a deity. <i>A deeply pious woman.</i>

reverential	Of the nature of, due to, or characterized by reverence. <i>Their names are always mentioned in reverential tones.</i>
sacrament	A formal religious ceremony conferring a specific grace on those who receive it; the two Protestant ceremonies are baptism and the Lord's Supper; in the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church there are seven traditional r. <i>They used peyote as a sacrament.</i>
sacred	Worthy of religious veneration. <i>Sacred bread and wine.</i>
sacrilege	Violation or misuse of what is regarded as sacred. <i>Putting ecclesiastical vestments to secular use was considered sacrilege.</i>
saintly	Very holy or virtuous. <i>A truly saintly woman.</i>
scripture	The sacred writings of a religion other than Christianity. <i>The fundamental teachings of the scriptures.</i>
shrine	Enshrine. <i>A Hindu shrine at which offerings are placed twice a day.</i>
votive	Dedicated in fulfillment of a vow. <i>Votive prayers.</i>
