<b>devoutness</b>	Water that has condensed on a cool surface overnight from water vapor in the air.
<b>godliness</b>	The quality of being devoutly religious; piety. <i>A man of great <b>godliness</b>.</i>
<b>goodness</b>	That which is pleasing or valuable or useful. <i>A belief in the basic <b>goodness</b> of mankind.</i>

<b>holiness</b>	Denoting a Christian renewal movement originating in the mid 19th century among Methodists in the US, emphasizing the Wesleyan doctrine of the sanctification of believers. <i>A life of <b>holiness</b> and total devotion to God.</i>
<b>piety</b>	The quality of being religious or reverent. <i>Acts of <b>piety</b> and charity.</i>
<b>piousness</b>	Righteousness by virtue of being pious.
<b><u>purity</u></b>	Freedom from immorality, especially of a sexual nature. <i>The <b>purity</b> of our drinking water.</i>
<b>righteousness</b>	The quality of being morally right or justifiable. <i>We had little doubt about the <b>righteousness</b> of our cause.</i>
<b>sacredness</b>	The quality of being sacred.
<b>saintliness</b>	The quality or state of being saintly; holiness. <i>Her selfless behaviour borders on <b>saintliness</b>.</i>
<b>sanctitude</b>	The quality of being holy.
<b><u>spirituality</u></b>	Property or income owned by a church. <i>The shift in priorities allows us to embrace our <b>spirituality</b> in a more profound way.</i>
<b>ultimate importance</b>	The finest or most superior quality of its kind.
<b>virtue</b>	Virginity or chastity, especially of a woman. <i>Mike was extolling the <b>virtues</b> of the car.</i>
<b>virtuousness</b>	The quality of doing what is right and avoiding what is wrong.

<b>blessed</b>	Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration. <i>He half stumbled out of the room up to his bed and <b>blessed blessed</b> sleep.</i> (in Christian belief) declare (bread and wine) to be or represent the body and
<b>consecrate</b>	blood of Christ. <i>A life <b>consecrated</b> to science.</i>
<b>dedicated</b>	Solemnly dedicated to or set apart for a high purpose. <i>A <b>dedicated</b> dancer.</i>
<b>devout</b>	Totally committed to a cause or belief. <i>A rabbi s <b>devout</b> prayers.</i>
<b>divine</b>	Resulting from divine providence. <i>The <b>divine</b> strength of Achilles.</i>
<b>divinity</b>	The study of religion; theology. <i>Ancient Egyptians believed in the <b>divinity</b> of the Pharaohs.</i>
<b>godly</b>	Emanating from God. <i>Everything is black or white satanic or <b>godly</b>.</i>
<b>hallowed</b>	Greatly revered and honoured. <i>The <b>hallowed</b> turf of Wimbledon.</i>
<b>heresy</b>	A belief that rejects the orthodox tenets of a religion. <i>The <b>heresy</b> of being uncommitted to the right political dogma.</i>
<b>holy</b>	A sacred place of pilgrimage. <i>I do not lead a <b>holy</b> life.</i>
<b>liturgy</b>	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>At the conclusion of the <b>liturgy</b> the Bishop presented the certificates.</i>
<b>oblation</b>	The act of offering the bread and wine of the Eucharist. <i><b>Oblations</b> for aid to the poor.</i>
<b>orison</b>	A prayer.
<b>pharisaic</b>	Excessively or hypocritically pious.
<b>piety</b>	The quality of being religious or reverent. <i>Acts of <b>piety</b> and charity.</i>
<b>pilgrimage</b>	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>Thousands <b>pilgrimage</b> there every year.</i>
<b>pious</b>	Having or showing or expressing reverence for a deity. <i>A deeply <b>pious</b> woman.</i>

- reverential** Of the nature of, due to, or characterized by reverence.  
*Their names are always mentioned in **reverential** tones.*
- sacrament** A formal religious ceremony conferring a specific grace on those who receive it; the two Protestant ceremonies are baptism and the Lord's Supper; in the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church there are seven traditional r.  
*They used peyote as a **sacrament**.*
- sacred** Worthy of religious veneration.  
***Sacred** bread and wine.*
- sacrilege** Violation or misuse of what is regarded as sacred.  
*Putting ecclesiastical vestments to secular use was considered **sacrilege**.*
- saintly** Very holy or virtuous.  
*A truly **saintly** woman.*
- scripture** The sacred writings of a religion other than Christianity.  
*The fundamental teachings of the **scriptures**.*
- shrine** Enshrine.  
*A Hindu **shrine** at which offerings are placed twice a day.*
- votive** Dedicated in fulfillment of a vow.  
***Votive** prayers.*
