**burlesque** Relating to or characteristic of a burlesque.  
*A novel which is a **burlesque** of the literary life.*

<b>captious</b>	Tending to find fault or raise petty objections. <i>A <b>captious</b> teacher.</i>
<b>comedy</b>	The style or genre represented by comedy films plays and broadcast programmes. <i>Satiric <b>comedy</b>.</i>
<b>condemning</b>	Containing or imposing condemnation or censure.
<b>contemptuous</b>	Expressing extreme contempt. <i>She was intolerant and <b>contemptuous</b> of the majority of the human race.</i>
<b>criticism</b>	A serious examination and judgment of something. <i>He ignored the <b>criticisms</b> of his friends.</i>
<b>criticize</b>	Indicate the faults of (someone or something) in a disapproving way. <i>Those who <b>criticize</b> others often are not perfect either.</i>
<b>cynical</b>	Believing the worst of human nature and motives; having a sneering disbelief in e.g. selflessness of others. <i>Most residents are <b>cynical</b> about efforts to clean mobsters out of their city.</i>
<b>cynicism</b>	A school of ancient Greek philosophers, the Cynics. <i><b>Cynicism</b> about the future.</i>
<b>despise</b>	Feel contempt or a deep repugnance for. <i>He <b>despises</b> the people he has to work for.</i>
<b>disrespectful</b>	Neither feeling nor showing respect. <i><b>Disrespectful</b> toward his teacher.</i>
<b>insulting</b>	Expressing extreme contempt. <i>Their language is <b>insulting</b> to women.</i>
<b>ironic</b>	Humorously sarcastic or mocking. <i>It was <b>ironical</b> that the well planned scheme failed so completely.</i>
<b>ironical</b>	Characterized by often poignant difference or incongruity between what is expected and what actually is. <i>An <b>ironical</b> smile.</i>
<b>irony</b>	Witty language used to convey insults or scorn-Jonathan Swif. <i><b>Irony</b> is wasted on the stupid.</i>
<b>mordant</b>	Impregnate or treat a fabric with a mordant. <i><b>Mordanted</b> wool.</i>
<b>paradox</b>	A statement or proposition which, despite sound (or apparently sound) reasoning from acceptable premises, leads to a conclusion that seems logically unacceptable or self-contradictory. <i>The liar <b>paradox</b>.</i>

<b><u>paradoxical</u></b>	Seemingly contradictory but nonetheless possibly true. <i>By glorifying the acts of violence they achieve the <b>paradoxical</b> effect of making them trivial.</i>
<b><u>parody</u></b>	Make a parody of. <i>The film is a <b>parody</b> of the horror genre.</i>
<b>polemic</b>	The practice of engaging in controversial debate or dispute. <i>His <b>polemic</b> against the cultural relativism of the Sixties.</i>
<b>sarcasm</b>	Witty language used to convey insults or scorn. <i>He used <b>sarcasm</b> to upset his opponent.</i>
<b><u>sardonic</u></b>	Grimly mocking or cynical. <i>Starkey attempted a <b>sardonic</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>satire</u></b>	A play novel film or other work which uses satire. <i>A stinging <b>satire</b> on American politics.</i>
<b>satiric</b>	Exposing human folly to ridicule. <i>A persistent campaign of mockery by the <b>satirical</b> fortnightly magazine.</i>
<b><u>satirical</u></b>	Containing or using satire. <i>A persistent campaign of mockery by the <b>satirical</b> fortnightly magazine.</i>
<b><u>scornful</u></b>	Expressing extreme contempt. <i><b>Scornful</b> laughter.</i>
<b>sneering</b>	Expressive of contempt. <i>Spoke in a <b>sneering</b> jeering manner.</i>
<b>spoof</b>	Imitate (something) while exaggerating its characteristic features for comic effect. <i>It is a movie that <b>spoofs</b> other movies.</i>
<b><u>trenchant</u></b>	Vigorous or incisive in expression or style. <i><b>Trenchant</b> criticism.</i>
