Synonyms of "Sass" as a noun (18 Words)

back talk	The posterior part of a human (or animal) body from the neck to the end of the spine.
backtalk	An impudent or insolent rejoinder.
bad manners	That which is below standard or expectations as of ethics or decency.
cheek	Either of the two large fleshy masses of muscular tissue that form the human rump. <i>Tears rolled down her cheeks.</i>
cheekiness	The trait of being rude and impertinent; inclined to take liberties.
<u>contempt</u>	A manner that is generally disrespectful and contemptuous. <i>He was held in contempt.</i>

discourtesy	A lack of politeness; a failure to show regard for others; wounding the feelings of others. <i>The fact that MPs were not kept informed was an extraordinary discourtesy.</i>
disrespect	A manner that is generally disrespectful and contemptuous. <i>Growing disrespect for the rule of law.</i>
impertinence	Inappropriate playfulness. <i>They gasped at the impertinence of the suggestion.</i>
impoliteness	A discourteous manner that ignores accepted social usage.
impudence	The trait of being rude and impertinent; inclined to take liberties. <i>His arrogance and impudence had offended many.</i>
incivility	Deliberate discourtesy. <i>Absenteeism and incivility were not tolerated.</i>
<u>insubordination</u>	Defiance of authority; refusal to obey orders. <i>He was dismissed for insubordination.</i>
lack of civility	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
lip	The top edge of a vessel or other container. <i>He kissed her on the lips.</i>
<u>mouth</u>	A horse's readiness to feel and obey the pressure of the bit in its mouth. <i>The jar had a wide mouth.</i>
<u>rudeness</u>	Roughness or simplicity. <i>Alice becomes disgusted by the rudeness of her three companions.</i>
sassing	An impudent or insolent rejoinder.



Usage Examples of "Sass" as a noun

- *Don't give me any of your sass.*
- *The kind of boy that wouldn't give you any sass.*
