

bad manners That which is below standard or expectations as of ethics or decency.

impoliteness A discourteous manner that ignores accepted social usage.

Deliberate discourtesy. incivility

Absenteeism and **incivility** were not tolerated.

Defiance of authority; refusal to obey orders. insubordination

He was dismissed for **insubordination**.

lack of civility The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.

He kissed her on the **lip**s.

A horse s readiness to feel and obey the pressure of the bit in its mouth. mouth


The jar had a wide **mouth**.
