- audacious** Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times.
*He made an **audacious** remark.*
- bad-mannered** Socially incorrect in behavior.
- bold** Very steep; having a prominent and almost vertical front.
*A coat with **bold** polka dots.*
- bold as brass** Clear and distinct.
- brazen** Unrestrained by convention or propriety.
*A **brazen** hussy.*
- brazen-faced** Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times.
- discourteous** Showing rudeness and a lack of consideration for other people.
*It would be unkind and **discourteous** to decline a visit.*
- disrespectful** Showing a lack of respect or courtesy; impolite.
***Disrespectful** in the presence of his parents.*

forward	Moving forward. <i>I am not usually a forward sort of person.</i>
fresh	Not yet used or soiled. <i>One truck driver decided to get fresh with me.</i>
ill-mannered	Socially incorrect in behavior.
impertinent	Not showing proper respect; rude. <i>Talk of rhetoric and strategy is impertinent to this process.</i>
impolite	Not having or showing good manners; rude. <i>It would have been impolite to refuse.</i>
impudent	Marked by casual disrespect. <i>An impudent boy given to insulting strangers.</i>
insolent	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. <i>She hated the insolent tone of his voice.</i>
insubordinate	Defiant of authority; disobedient to orders. <i>An insubordinate attitude.</i>
insulting	Expressing extreme contempt. <i>Their language is insulting to women.</i>
irreverent	Not revering god. <i>A certain irreverent gaiety and ease of manner.</i>
overbold	Excessively bold. <i>Outlaws from the forests had grown overbold.</i>
overfamiliar	Too well acquainted with. <i>The researcher is overfamiliar with the community.</i>
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>No need to be pert miss.</i>
presumptuous	Excessively forward. <i>I hope I won't be considered presumptuous if I offer some advice.</i>
rude	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>Bales of rude cotton.</i>
saucy	Sexually suggestive in a light-hearted and humorous way. <i>Saucy postcards.</i>
shameless	Feeling no shame. <i>His shameless hypocrisy.</i>
smart	Painfully severe. <i>He gave the dog a smart blow.</i>

- unmannerly** Socially incorrect in behavior.
*Uncouth **unmannerly** fellows.*
- wise** Having knowledge in a specified subject.
*A **wise** and perceptive comment.*
