## Synonyms of "Sassy" as an adjective (28 Words)

- audacious** Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times.  
*He made an **audacious** remark.*
- bad-mannered** Socially incorrect in behavior.
- bold** Very steep; having a prominent and almost vertical front.  
*A coat with **bold** polka dots.*
- bold as brass** Clear and distinct.
- brazen** Unrestrained by convention or propriety.  
*A **brazen** hussy.*
- brazen-faced** Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times.
- discourteous** Showing rudeness and a lack of consideration for other people.  
*It would be unkind and **discourteous** to decline a visit.*
- disrespectful** Showing a lack of respect or courtesy; impolite.  
***Disrespectful** in the presence of his parents.*

<b>forward</b>	Moving forward. <i>I am not usually a <b>forward</b> sort of person.</i>
<b>fresh</b>	Not yet used or soiled. <i>One truck driver decided to get <b>fresh</b> with me.</i>
<b>ill-mannered</b>	Socially incorrect in behavior.
<b>impertinent</b>	Not showing proper respect; rude. <i>Talk of rhetoric and strategy is <b>impertinent</b> to this process.</i>
<b>impolite</b>	Not having or showing good manners; rude. <i>It would have been <b>impolite</b> to refuse.</i>
<b>impudent</b>	Marked by casual disrespect. <i>An <b>impudent</b> boy given to insulting strangers.</i>
<b>insolent</b>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. <i>She hated the <b>insolent</b> tone of his voice.</i>
<b>insubordinate</b>	Defiant of authority; disobedient to orders. <i>An <b>insubordinate</b> attitude.</i>
<b>insulting</b>	Expressing extreme contempt. <i>Their language is <b>insulting</b> to women.</i>
<b>irreverent</b>	Not revering god. <i>A certain <b>irreverent</b> gaiety and ease of manner.</i>
<b>overbold</b>	Excessively bold. <i>Outlaws from the forests had grown <b>overbold</b>.</i>
<b>overfamiliar</b>	Too well acquainted with. <i>The researcher is <b>overfamiliar</b> with the community.</i>
<b>pert</b>	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>No need to be <b>pert</b> miss.</i>
<b>presumptuous</b>	Excessively forward. <i>I hope I won't be considered <b>presumptuous</b> if I offer some advice.</i>
<b>rude</b>	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>Bales of <b>rude</b> cotton.</i>
<b>saucy</b>	Sexually suggestive in a light-hearted and humorous way. <i><b>Saucy</b> postcards.</i>
<b>shameless</b>	Feeling no shame. <i>His <b>shameless</b> hypocrisy.</i>
<b>smart</b>	Painfully severe. <i>He gave the dog a <b>smart</b> blow.</i>



- unmannerly** Socially incorrect in behavior.  
*Uncouth **unmannerly** fellows.*
- wise** Having knowledge in a specified subject.  
*A **wise** and perceptive comment.*
