<b>content</b>	Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are. <i>He had to be <b>content</b> with third place.</i>
<b>contented</b>	Willing to accept something; satisfied. <i>She gave a <b>contented</b> little smile.</i>
<b>fulfilled</b>	Completed to perfection. <i>I am confident in this role and feel <b>fulfilled</b>.</i>
<b>gratified</b>	Having received what was desired.
<b>happy</b>	Marked by good fortune. <i>They are <b>happy</b> to see me doing well.</i>
<b>pleased</b>	Proud of one's achievements, especially excessively so; self-satisfied. <i>A <b>pleased</b> smile.</i>
<b>quenched</b>	Allayed. <i>An uprising <b>quenched</b> almost before it started.</i>
<b>slaked</b>	Allayed.



**well pleased** Resulting favorably.

- blessedness** A state of supreme happiness.
- bliss** A state of extreme happiness.  
*Blissed out hippies.*
- complacency** A feeling of smug or uncritical satisfaction with oneself or one's achievements.  
*His **complacency** was absolutely disgusting.*
- complacent** Contented to a fault with oneself or one's actions.  
*You can't afford to be **complacent** about security.*
- content** The state of being contented with your situation in life.  
*Not **content** with being a hugely successful pop star he now intends to venture into movies.*
- contented** Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are.  
*A **contented** smile.*

<b><u>contentment</u></b>	Happiness with one's situation in life. <i>He found <b>contentment</b> in living a simple life in the country.</i>
<b>delectation</b>	A feeling of extreme pleasure or satisfaction. <i>They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our <b>delectation</b>.</i>
<b>delighted</b>	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>We were <b>delighted</b> to see her.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> surprise.</i>
<b>elated</b>	Ecstatically happy. <i>Dozens of <b>elated</b> fans welcomed the champions home.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>They had an <b>enjoyable</b> afternoon.</i>
<b><u>euphoria</u></b>	A feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness. <i>In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
<b>exult</b>	To express great joy. <i><b>Exulting</b> in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>felicity</b>	A particularly effective feature of a work of literature or art. <i>Domestic <b>felicity</b>.</i>
<b><u>glad</u></b>	Causing happiness. <i>Gave a <b>glad</b> shout.</i>
<b>gladden</b>	Become glad or happy. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that <b>gladdened</b> her heart.</i>
<b>gladness</b>	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
<b><u>gratification</u></b>	The act or an instance of satisfying. <i>A thirst for sexual <b>gratification</b>.</i>
<b>gratify</b>	Yield (to); give satisfaction to. <i>She was gratified to see the shock in Jim's eyes.</i>
<b>happiness</b>	Emotions experienced when in a state of well-being. <i>She struggled to find <b>happiness</b> in her life.</i>
<b>jollity</b>	Feeling jolly and jovial and full of good humor. <i>He was full of false <b>jollity</b>.</i>
<b>joviality</b>	A jovial nature.
<b>laughing</b>	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i><b>Laughing</b> children.</i>



- pleased** Willing or glad to do something.  
*A **pleased** smile.*
- pleasurable** Pleasing; enjoyable.  
***Pleasurable** activities.*
- satisfaction** The payment of a debt or fulfillment of an obligation.  
*I looked round with **satisfaction**.*
- satisfactorily** In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably.  
*The plan has not worked **satisfactorily**.*
- smug** Having or showing an excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements.  
*A **smug** glow of self congratulation.*
