content	Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are. <i>He had to be content with third place.</i>
contented	Willing to accept something; satisfied. <i>She gave a contented little smile.</i>
<u>fulfilled</u>	Completed to perfection. <i>I am confident in this role and feel fulfilled.</i>
gratified	Having received what was desired.
happy	Marked by good fortune. <i>They are happy to see me doing well.</i>
<u>pleased</u>	Proud of one's achievements, especially excessively so; self-satisfied. <i>A pleased smile.</i>
quenched	Allayed. <i>An uprising quenched almost before it started.</i>
slaked	Allayed.

well pleased Resulting favorably.

- bliss** A state of extreme happiness.

- complacency** A feeling of smug or uncritical satisfaction with oneself or one's achievements.
*His **complacency** was absolutely disgusting.*
- complacent** Contented to a fault with oneself or one's actions.
*You can't afford to be **complacent** about security.*
- content** The state of being contented with your situation in life.
*Not **content** with being a hugely successful pop star he now intends to venture into movies.*
- contented** Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are.
*A **contented** smile.*

<u>contentment</u>	Happiness with one's situation in life. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>
delectation	A feeling of extreme pleasure or satisfaction. <i>They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our delectation.</i>
delighted	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>
<u>delightful</u>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A delightful surprise.</i>
elated	Ecstatically happy. <i>Dozens of elated fans welcomed the champions home.</i>
enjoyable	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>They had an enjoyable afternoon.</i>
<u>euphoria</u>	A feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness. <i>In his euphoria he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
exult	To express great joy. <i>Exulting in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.</i>
exultant	Triumphantly happy. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
felicity	A particularly effective feature of a work of literature or art. <i>Domestic felicity.</i>
<u>glad</u>	Causing happiness. <i>Gave a glad shout.</i>
gladden	Become glad or happy. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that gladdened her heart.</i>
gladness	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
<u>gratification</u>	The act or an instance of satisfying. <i>A thirst for sexual gratification.</i>
gratify	Yield (to); give satisfaction to. <i>She was gratified to see the shock in Jim's eyes.</i>
happiness	Emotions experienced when in a state of well-being. <i>She struggled to find happiness in her life.</i>
jollity	Feeling jolly and jovial and full of good humor. <i>He was full of false jollity.</i>
joviality	A jovial nature.
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>

- pleased** Willing or glad to do something.
*A **pleased** smile.*
- pleasurable** Pleasing; enjoyable.
***Pleasurable** activities.*
- satisfaction** The payment of a debt or fulfillment of an obligation.
*I looked round with **satisfaction**.*
- satisfactorily** In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably.
*The plan has not worked **satisfactorily**.*
- smug** Having or showing an excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements.
*A **smug** glow of self congratulation.*
