slaked Allayed.




well pleased Resulting favorably.

Exulting in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.

exultant Triumphantly happy.

He waved to the **exultant** crowds.

felicity A particularly effective feature of a work of literature or art.

Domestic **felicity**.

glad Causing happiness.

Gave a **glad** shout.

gladden Become glad or happy.

The high childish laugh was a sound that **gladden**ed her heart.

gladness Experiencing joy and pleasure.

gratification The act or an instance of satisfying. *A thirst for sexual gratification.*
