- enjoyable** (of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure.
*They had an **enjoyable** afternoon.*
- fulfilling** Making someone satisfied or happy through allowing their character or abilities to develop fully.
*A **fulfilling** and rewarding career.*
- gratifying** Giving pleasure or satisfaction.
*The results were **gratifying**.*

<u>hearty</u>	Endowed with or exhibiting great bodily or mental health. <i>A hearty meal.</i>
pleasing	Pleasant or agreeable to the senses. <i>A pleasing piece of news.</i>
<u>pleasurable</u>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>Full of happiness and pleasurable excitement.</i>
reasonable	(of a price or product) not too expensive. <i>Reasonable prices.</i>
rewarding	Providing personal satisfaction. <i>A rewarding career as a paramedic.</i>
<u>satisfactory</u>	Meeting requirements. <i>Satisfactory living conditions.</i>
<u>solid</u>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>The solid outline encloses the area within which we measured.</i>
<u>square</u>	Having the shape or approximate shape of a square. <i>A square contradiction.</i>
<u>substantial</u>	Of or relating to the real nature or essential elements of something. <i>Breakfast is a substantial buffet.</i>

blissfully	In a way that provides perfect happiness or great joy. <i>They are blissfully in love.</i>
cheering	Shouting for joy or in praise or encouragement. <i>A cheering crowd.</i>
comforting	Providing freedom from worry. <i>A comforting bowl of soup.</i>
content	Make content. <i>They could read to their hearts content.</i>
<u>contentment</u>	Happiness with one's situation in life. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>

enjoyable	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The company was enjoyable.</i>
entertain	Provide entertainment for. <i>Washington entertained little hope of an early improvement in relations.</i>
<u>euphoric</u>	Characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness. <i>A euphoric sense of freedom.</i>
<u>exhilarating</u>	Making lively and cheerful. <i>An exhilarating two hour rafting experience.</i>
<u>glad</u>	Make happy; please. <i>Glad that they succeeded.</i>
gratifying	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The results were gratifying.</i>
happy	Marked by good fortune. <i>We will be happy to advise you.</i>

hearty	Showing warm and heartfelt friendliness. <i>A hearty meal.</i>
jollity	Feeling jolly and jovial and full of good humor. <i>A night of riotous jollity.</i>
joyful	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>Make a joyful noise.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
merriment	A gay feeling. <i>Her eyes sparkled with merriment.</i>
pleasant	Having pleasing manners or behavior. <i>A very pleasant evening.</i>
pleasantness	The feeling caused by agreeable stimuli; one pole of a continuum of states of feeling. <i>The pleasantness of a cool breeze on a hot summer day.</i>
pleasantry	An agreeable or amusing remark. <i>He laughed at his own pleasantry.</i>
pleasing	Giving pleasure and satisfaction. <i>The pleasing austerity of the surroundings.</i>
pleasurable	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>Good printing makes a book more pleasurable to read.</i>
pleasure	A formal expression. <i>Risky verbal exchanges that the pair might pleasure in.</i>
rewarding	Providing personal satisfaction. <i>A rewarding career as a paramedic.</i>
wholesome	Sound or exhibiting soundness in body or mind. <i>Exercise develops wholesome appetites.</i>
