## Saturated as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Saturated" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “saturated” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of an organic molecule) containing the greatest possible number of hydrogen atoms, without carbon-carbon double or triple bonds.*
- *Denoting fats containing a high proportion of fatty acid molecules without double bonds, considered to be less healthy in the diet than unsaturated fats.*
- *Used especially of organic compounds; having all available valence bonds filled.*
- *(of a solution) containing the largest possible amount of a particular solute.*
- *Having or holding as much as can be absorbed of something.*
- *Being chromatically pure; not diluted with white or grey or black.*
- *(of colour) very bright, full, and free from an admixture of white.*
- *Holding as much water or moisture as can be absorbed; thoroughly soaked.*
- *Being the most concentrated solution possible at a given temperature; unable to dissolve still more of a substance.*
- *(of color) being chromatically pure; not diluted with white or grey or black.*



## Synonyms of "Saturated" as an adjective (16 Words)

- boggy** Too wet and muddy to be easily walked on; marshy.  
*The shrub grows naturally in **boggy** ground.*
- concentrated** Being the most concentrated solution possible at a given temperature unable to dissolve still more of a substance.

- drenched** Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination.  
***Drenched** in moonlight.*
- dripping** Very wet.

<b>pure</b>	Of color being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>It was revenge <b>pure</b> and simple.</i>
<b>soaked</b>	Very drunk. <i>Rain <b>soaked</b> streets.</i>
<b>soaking</b>	Extremely wet; wet through. <i>Your hair s <b>soaking</b> wet.</i>
<b>sodden</b>	Having drunk an excessive amount of a particular alcoholic drink. <i>A whisky <b>sodden</b> criminal.</i>
<b>soggy</b>	(of soil) soft and watery. <i>We squelched through the <b>soggy</b> ground.</i>
<b>sopping</b>	Saturated with liquid; wet through. <i>The handkerchief was <b>sopping</b> wet.</i>
<b>sopping wet</b>	Consisting of or trading in alcoholic liquor.
<b>swampy</b>	Soft and watery. <i><b>Swampy</b> bayous.</i>
<b>waterlogged</b>	Saturated with or full of water. <i>Parts of the racecourse were <b>waterlogged</b>.</i>
<b>wet through</b>	Covered or soaked with a liquid such as water.

<b>dusty</b>	(of a colour) dull or muted. <i>A <b>dusty</b> pile of books.</i>
<b>flooded</b>	Covered with water. <i>A <b>flooded</b> bathroom.</i>
<b>foggy</b>	Unable to think clearly; confused. <i>A dark and <b>foggy</b> night.</i>
<b>humid</b>	Containing or characterized by a great deal of water vapor. <i><b>Humid</b> weather.</i>
<b>humidity</b>	Wetness in the atmosphere. <i>The temperature is seventy seven the <b>humidity</b> in the low thirties.</i>
<b>marshland</b>	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Acres of meadows and <b>marshlands</b>.</i>
<b>marshy</b>	(of soil) soft and watery. <i>A <b>marshy</b> coastline.</i>
<b>misty</b>	(of a colour) not bright; soft. <i>The <b>misty</b> air above the frozen river.</i>
<b>moist</b>	(of a climate) rainy. <i>Her brother s eyes became <b>moist</b>.</i>
<b>moisture</b>	Wetness caused by water. <i>The air was constantly heavy with <b>moisture</b>.</i>
<b>moisturize</b>	Make (something, especially the skin) less dry. <i>Revitalize your face <b>moisturize</b> your skin.</i>
<b>rainy</b>	(of weather) wet by periods of rain. <i>A <b>rainy</b> afternoon.</i>
<b>saturate</b>	Saturated with moisture. <i>Japan s electronics industry began to <b>saturate</b> the world markets.</i>
<b>smog</b>	Air pollution by a mixture of smoke and fog. <i>Exhaust emissions are mainly responsible for the <b>smog</b>.</i>
<b>soak</b>	Washing something by allowing it to soak. <i>Cold water was <b>soaking</b> into my shoes.</i>
<b>soaked</b>	Very drunk. <i>He got absolutely <b>soaked</b> in the rain.</i>
<b>sodden</b>	Saturated with liquid, especially water; soaked through. <i>The rains have <b>soddened</b> the earth.</i>
<b>soggy</b>	(of soil) soft and watery. <i>The chorus sings powerfully but the interpretation is ultimately <b>soggy</b>.</i>

**splashing** The act of splashing a liquid substance on a surface.

**sponge** Remove or wipe away liquid or a mark with a sponge or cloth.  
*A chocolate **sponge**.*

**thirsty** Needing moisture.  
*The earth was dry and **thirsty**.*

**tropics** The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.

**vapor** The process of becoming a vapor.

**wet** Cause to become wet.  
***Wet** methods of photography.*
