Definitions of "Saturated" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "saturated" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of an organic molecule) containing the greatest possible number of hydrogen atoms, without carbon-carbon double or triple bonds.
- Denoting fats containing a high proportion of fatty acid molecules without double bonds, considered to be less healthy in the diet than unsaturated fats.
- Used especially of organic compounds; having all available valence bonds filled.
- (of a solution) containing the largest possible amount of a particular solute.
- Having or holding as much as can be absorbed of something.
- Being chromatically pure; not diluted with white or grey or black.
- (of colour) very bright, full, and free from an admixture of white.
- Holding as much water or moisture as can be absorbed; thoroughly soaked.
- Being the most concentrated solution possible at a given temperature; unable to dissolve still more of a substance.
- (of color) being chromatically pure; not diluted with white or grey or black.






Synonyms of "Saturated" as an adjective (16 Words)

boggy	Too wet and muddy to be easily walked on; marshy. <i>The shrub grows naturally in boggy ground.</i>
concentrated	Being the most concentrated solution possible at a given temperature unable to dissolve still more of a substance. <i>Concentrated</i> study.
<u>drenched</u>	Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination. Drenched in moonlight.
<u>dripping</u>	Very wet. Dripping wet hair.
heavy	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. The clayey soil was heavy and easily saturated.
muddy	Discolored by impurities; not bright and clear is often used in combination The original colours were blurred into muddy pink and yellow.



<u>pure</u>	Of color being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>It was revenge pure and simple.</i>
<u>soaked</u>	Very drunk. Rain soaked streets.
soaking	Extremely wet; wet through. Your hair s soaking wet.
sodden	Having drunk an excessive amount of a particular alcoholic drink. A whisky sodden criminal.
soggy	(of soil) soft and watery. We squelched through the soggy ground.
sopping	Saturated with liquid; wet through. The handkerchief was sopping wet.
sopping wet	Consisting of or trading in alcoholic liquor.
swampy	Soft and watery. <i>Swampy</i> bayous.
waterlogged	Saturated with or full of water. Parts of the racecourse were waterlogged .
wet through	Covered or soaked with a liquid such as water.

aqueous	Produced by the action of water. An aqueous solution of potassium permanganate.
awash	Containing large numbers or amounts of someone or something. A rock awash outside the reef entrance.
<u>damp</u>	Damp air or atmosphere. The damp s of the valley.
dampness	The state or condition of being slightly wet. The dampness in the air.
drench	Drench or submerge or be drenched or submerged. I fell in the stream and was drench ed.
<u>drenched</u>	Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination. Drenched in moonlight.



<u>dusty</u>	(of a colour) dull or muted. A dusty pile of books.
<u>flooded</u>	Covered with water. A flooded bathroom.
<u>foggy</u>	Unable to think clearly; confused. A dark and foggy night.
<u>humid</u>	Containing or characterized by a great deal of water vapor. <i>Humid</i> weather.
humidity	Wetness in the atmosphere. <i>The temperature is seventy seven the humidity in the low thirties.</i>
marshland	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. Acres of meadows and marshlands .
marshy	(of soil) soft and watery. A marshy coastline.
misty	(of a colour) not bright; soft. <i>The misty air above the frozen river.</i>
<u>moist</u>	(of a climate) rainy. <i>Her brother s eyes became moist.</i>
moisture	Wetness caused by water. The air was constantly heavy with moisture .
moisturize	Make (something, especially the skin) less dry. <i>Revitalize your face moisturize your skin.</i>
rainy	(of weather) wet by periods of rain. A rainy afternoon.
<u>saturate</u>	Saturated with moisture. Japan s electronics industry began to saturate the world markets.
smog	Air pollution by a mixture of smoke and fog. <i>Exhaust emissions are mainly responsible for the</i> smog .
<u>soak</u>	Washing something by allowing it to soak. Cold water was soak ing into my shoes.
<u>soaked</u>	Very drunk. He got absolutely soaked in the rain.
sodden	Saturated with liquid, especially water; soaked through. <i>The rains have soddened the earth.</i>
soggy	(of soil) soft and watery. <i>The chorus sings powerfully but the interpretation is ultimately</i> soggy .



splashing	The act of splashing a liquid substance on a surface.
sponge	Remove or wipe away liquid or a mark with a sponge or cloth. <i>A chocolate sponge</i> .
<u>thirsty</u>	Needing moisture. The earth was dry and thirsty .
tropics	The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.
vapor	The process of becoming a vapor.
<u>wet</u>	Cause to become wet. <i>Wet</i> methods of photography.
