Definitions of "Saturated" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "saturated" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of an organic molecule) containing the greatest possible number of hydrogen atoms, without carbon-carbon double or triple bonds.
- Denoting fats containing a high proportion of fatty acid molecules without double bonds, considered to be less healthy in the diet than unsaturated fats.
- Used especially of organic compounds; having all available valence bonds filled.
- (of a solution) containing the largest possible amount of a particular solute.
- Having or holding as much as can be absorbed of something.
- Being chromatically pure; not diluted with white or grey or black.
- (of colour) very bright, full, and free from an admixture of white.
- Holding as much water or moisture as can be absorbed; thoroughly soaked.
- Being the most concentrated solution possible at a given temperature; unable to dissolve still more of a substance.
- (of color) being chromatically pure; not diluted with white or grey or black.





Synonyms of "Saturated" as an adjective (16 Words)

Too wet and muddy to be easily walked on; marshy. boggy

We squelched through the **soggy** ground.

sopping Saturated with liquid; wet through. *The handkerchief was sopping wet.*

sopping wet Consisting of or trading in alcoholic liquor.

Soft and watery.

Swampy bayous.

Saturated with or full of water.

waterlogged Parts of the racecourse were waterlogged.

wet through Covered or soaked with a liquid such as water.
