Saturated as an Adjective

Definitions of "Saturated" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “saturated” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

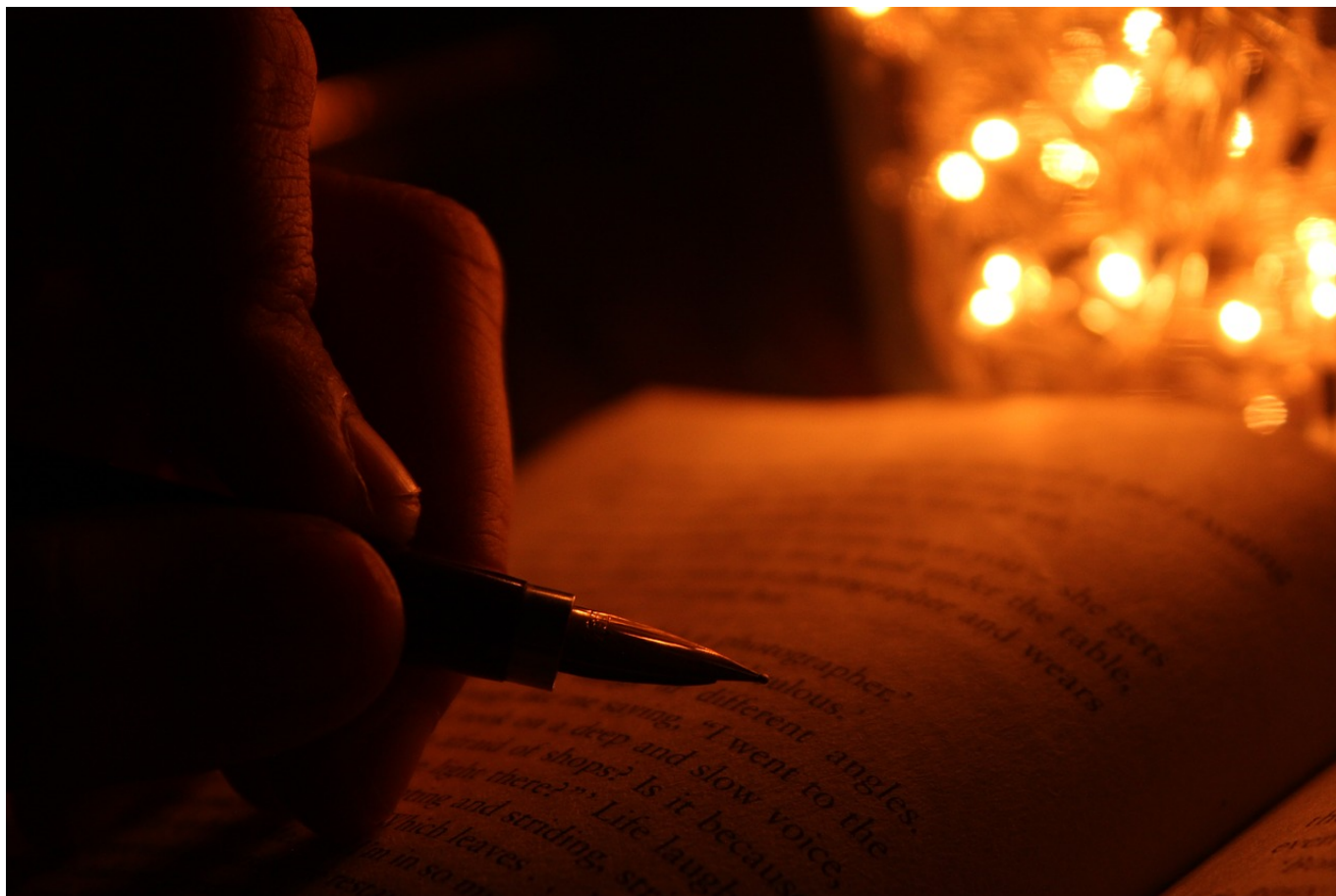
- *(of an organic molecule) containing the greatest possible number of hydrogen atoms, without carbon-carbon double or triple bonds.*
- *Denoting fats containing a high proportion of fatty acid molecules without double bonds, considered to be less healthy in the diet than unsaturated fats.*
- *Used especially of organic compounds; having all available valence bonds filled.*
- *(of a solution) containing the largest possible amount of a particular solute.*
- *Having or holding as much as can be absorbed of something.*
- *Being chromatically pure; not diluted with white or grey or black.*
- *(of colour) very bright, full, and free from an admixture of white.*
- *Holding as much water or moisture as can be absorbed; thoroughly soaked.*
- *Being the most concentrated solution possible at a given temperature; unable to dissolve still more of a substance.*
- *(of color) being chromatically pure; not diluted with white or grey or black.*



Synonyms of "Saturated" as an adjective (16 Words)

boggy	Too wet and muddy to be easily walked on; marshy. <i>The shrub grows naturally in boggy ground.</i>
concentrated	Being the most concentrated solution possible at a given temperature unable to dissolve still more of a substance. <i>Concentrated study.</i>
<u>drenched</u>	Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination. <i>Drenched in moonlight.</i>
<u>dripping</u>	Very wet. <i>Dripping wet hair.</i>
heavy	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>The clayey soil was heavy and easily saturated.</i>
muddy	Discolored by impurities; not bright and clear is often used in combination. <i>The original colours were blurred into muddy pink and yellow.</i>

<u>pure</u>	Of color being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>It was revenge pure and simple.</i>
<u>soaked</u>	Very drunk. <i>Rain soaked streets.</i>
soaking	Extremely wet; wet through. <i>Your hair s soaking wet.</i>
sodden	Having drunk an excessive amount of a particular alcoholic drink. <i>A whisky sodden criminal.</i>
soggy	(of soil) soft and watery. <i>We squelched through the soggy ground.</i>
sopping	Saturated with liquid; wet through. <i>The handkerchief was sopping wet.</i>
sopping wet	Consisting of or trading in alcoholic liquor.
swampy	Soft and watery. <i>Swampy bayous.</i>
waterlogged	Saturated with or full of water. <i>Parts of the racecourse were waterlogged.</i>
wet through	Covered or soaked with a liquid such as water.

aqueous	Produced by the action of water. <i>An aqueous solution of potassium permanganate.</i>
awash	Containing large numbers or amounts of someone or something. <i>A rock awash outside the reef entrance.</i>
damp	Damp air or atmosphere. <i>The damps of the valley.</i>
dampness	The state or condition of being slightly wet. <i>The dampness in the air.</i>
drench	Drench or submerge or be drenched or submerged. <i>I fell in the stream and was drenched.</i>
drenched	Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination. <i>Drenched in moonlight.</i>

dusty	(of a colour) dull or muted. <i>A dusty pile of books.</i>
flooded	Covered with water. <i>A flooded bathroom.</i>
foggy	Unable to think clearly; confused. <i>A dark and foggy night.</i>
humid	Containing or characterized by a great deal of water vapor. <i>Humid weather.</i>
humidity	Wetness in the atmosphere. <i>The temperature is seventy seven the humidity in the low thirties.</i>
marshland	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Acres of meadows and marshlands.</i>
marshy	(of soil) soft and watery. <i>A marshy coastline.</i>
misty	(of a colour) not bright; soft. <i>The misty air above the frozen river.</i>
moist	(of a climate) rainy. <i>Her brother s eyes became moist.</i>
moisture	Wetness caused by water. <i>The air was constantly heavy with moisture.</i>
moisturize	Make (something, especially the skin) less dry. <i>Revitalize your face moisturize your skin.</i>
rainy	(of weather) wet by periods of rain. <i>A rainy afternoon.</i>
saturate	Saturated with moisture. <i>Japan s electronics industry began to saturate the world markets.</i>
smog	Air pollution by a mixture of smoke and fog. <i>Exhaust emissions are mainly responsible for the smog.</i>
soak	Washing something by allowing it to soak. <i>Cold water was soaking into my shoes.</i>
soaked	Very drunk. <i>He got absolutely soaked in the rain.</i>
sodden	Saturated with liquid, especially water; soaked through. <i>The rains have soddened the earth.</i>
soggy	(of soil) soft and watery. <i>The chorus sings powerfully but the interpretation is ultimately soggy.</i>

splashing The act of splashing a liquid substance on a surface.

sponge Remove or wipe away liquid or a mark with a sponge or cloth.
*A chocolate **sponge**.*

thirsty Needing moisture.
*The earth was dry and **thirsty**.*

tropics The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.

vapor The process of becoming a vapor.

wet Cause to become wet.
***Wet** methods of photography.*
