angularity	A shape having one or more sharp angles.
aphelion	Apoapsis in solar orbit; the point in the orbit of a planet or comet that is at the greatest distance from the sun. <i>Mars is at aphelion.</i>
blemish	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>Thousands of Web pages are blemished with embarrassing typos.</i>
blotch	Cover with blotches. <i>Red blotches on her face.</i>
centered	Being or placed in the center.
central	A workplace that serves as a telecommunications facility where lines from telephones can be connected together to permit communication. <i>Central government.</i>
concentric	Having a common center. <i>Concentric rings.</i>
disproof	The action of proving that something is untrue. <i>The answer ought to turn on considerations that are susceptible to verification or disproof.</i>
dot	Make a dot or dots. <i>You need to dot the i.</i>
emphatically	In a forceful way. <i>Jane though born in California feels emphatically English.</i>
focal	Relating to the centre or most important part. <i>Focal infection.</i>
fulcrum	The pivot about which a lever turns. <i>Research is the fulcrum of the academic community.</i>
homocentric	Having the same centre.

jag	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>He clutched a jag of the rock.</i>
keynote	Set the keynote of. <i>Comfort keynotes this designer s Fall collection.</i>
mote	(nontechnical usage) a tiny piece of anything. <i>The tiniest mote of dust.</i>
mottle	A spot or patch forming part of a mottled arrangement. <i>The ship was not dull grey as distance had suggested but a mottle of khaki and black and olive green.</i>
<u>pivot</u>	The act of turning on or as if on a pivot. <i>The pivot of community life was the chapel.</i>
<u>pivotal</u>	Being of crucial importance- Henry Kissinger. <i>Japan s pivotal role in the world economy.</i>
prospect	A prediction of the course of a disease. <i>There was no prospect of a reconciliation.</i>
refutation	The action of proving a statement or theory to be wrong or false. <i>He fails to give a clear refutation of the argument.</i>
soupcon	A slight but appreciable amount.
speck	Produce specks in or on. <i>The figure in the distance had become a mere speck.</i>
plotch	A blob or smear of something, typically a liquid. <i>A plotch of red in a larger area of yellow.</i>
<u>spot</u>	Make a spot or mark onto. <i>The higher rated team spots the lower rated team the difference in their handicaps.</i>
stain	Produce or leave stains. <i>People knew how to stain glass a beautiful blue in the middle ages.</i>
<u>standpoint</u>	A mental position from which things are viewed. <i>She writes on religion from the standpoint of a believer.</i>
<u>streak</u>	Cover a surface with streaks. <i>A streak for charity.</i>
<u>stud</u>	The height of a room as indicated by the length of a timber wall stud. <i>Diamond stud earrings.</i>
vertex	The highest point; the top or apex.
