impertinence Inappropriate playfulness.

They gasped at the **impertinence** of the suggestion.

impudence An impudent statement.

His arrogance and **impudence** had offended many.

insolence Rude and disrespectful behaviour.

She was sacked for **insolence**.

irreverence A disrespectful act.

An attitude of **irreverence** towards politicians.

ketchup Thick spicy sauce made from tomatoes.

An alcoholic beverage that is distilled rather than fermented.

Waste **liquor**s.

pertnessQuality of being lively and confident.

There was a **pertness** about her that attracted him.

bake A social gathering at which baked food of a specified kind is eaten.

boil stock.

bouillon A clear seasoned broth.



bread Coat food with breadcrumbs before cooking.

Bread the pork chops before frying them.

Liquid in which meat and vegetables are simmered; used as a basis for e.g.

broth soups or sauces.

chili Ground beef and chili peppers or chili powder often with tomatoes and

flour Grind grain into flour.

Flour fish or meat before frying it.

hominy Hulled corn with the bran and germ removed.

Hominy grits.

juice A drink made from fruit or vegetable juice.

I know there are 82 players on the **juice**.

lasagna Baked dish of layers of lasagna pasta with sauce and cheese and meat or

vegetables.

An item of sweet food made by baking a mixture of stiffly beaten egg whites

meringue and sugar until crisp.

Cover the pudding with **meringue**.

A very thin, long strip of pasta or a similar flour paste, eaten with a sauce or

noodle in a soup.

Cook the **noodle**s in a large pan of boiling water.

Chimpanzees more closely related to Australopithecus than to other

pan pongids.

Heavy spikes can be useful in breaking a surface **pan** in grassland.

pasta A dish that contains pasta as its main ingredient.



A baked dish of fruit, or meat and vegetables, typically with a top and base

pie of pastry.

A slice of **pizza**.

soup Any composition having a consistency suggestive of soup.

spaghetti An Italian dish consisting largely of spaghetti typically with a sauce.

spicy Spicy gossip.

A contestant in a team sport who is in the game at the beginning.

starter Consumers upgrading from a regular mobile phone to a **starter**

smartphone.

stew Food prepared by stewing especially meat or fish with vegetables.
