- *A liquid or semi-liquid substance served with food to add moistness and flavour.*
- *Impertinence; cheek.*
- *Flavorful relish or dressing or topping served as an accompaniment to food.*

<b>alcohol</b>	Drink containing alcohol. <i>It is an offence to drive if you have more than 80 mg of <b>alcohol</b> per 100 ml of blood.</i>
<b>alcoholic drink</b>	A person who drinks alcohol to excess habitually.
<b>audaciousness</b>	Aggressive boldness or unmitigated effrontery.
<b>audacity</b>	A willingness to take bold risks. <i>He had the <b>audacity</b> to question my decision.</i>
<b>boldness</b>	The quality of having a strong, vivid, or clear appearance. <i>A president who is showing incredible <b>boldness</b> in going after the cartels.</i>
<b>brazenness</b>	Behavior marked by a bold defiance of the proprieties and lack of shame.
<b>cheek</b>	Impudent aggressiveness. <i>Gabriel had to bite his <b>cheeks</b> to keep from laughing.</i>
<b>cheekiness</b>	The trait of being rude and impertinent; inclined to take liberties.
<b>cockiness</b>	Offensive boldness and assertiveness.

<b>condiment</b>	A substance such as salt, mustard, or pickle that is used to add flavour to food. <i>Mustard and ketchup are <b>condiments</b>.</i>
<b>disrespect</b>	A manner that is generally disrespectful and contemptuous. <i>Growing <b>disrespect</b> for the rule of law.</i>
<b>dressng</b>	Savory dressings for salads basically of two kinds either the thin French or vinaigrette type or the creamy mayonnaise type. <i>Vinaigrette <b>dressng</b>.</i>
<b>effrontery</b>	Audacious (even arrogant) behavior that you have no right to. <i>One juror had the <b>effrontery</b> to challenge the coroner s decision.</i>
<b>familiarity</b>	Personal knowledge or information about someone or something. <i>His <b>familiarity</b> with the works of Thomas Hardy.</i>
<b>flavouring</b>	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>Vanilla <b>flavouring</b>.</i>
<b>flippancy</b>	Lack of respect or seriousness; frivolousness. <i>She was infuriated by his careless <b>flippancy</b>.</i>
<b>forwardness</b>	Prompt willingness. <i>The <b>forwardness</b> of the harvest this year.</i>
<b>freshness</b>	(with reference to food) the state of being recently made or obtained or not having decayed. <i>The <b>freshness</b> of the wind with its cooling air.</i>
<b>impertinence</b>	Inappropriate playfulness. <i>They gasped at the <b>impertinence</b> of the suggestion.</i>
<b>impudence</b>	An impudent statement. <i>His arrogance and <b>impudence</b> had offended many.</i>
<b>insolence</b>	Rude and disrespectful behaviour. <i>She was sacked for <b>insolence</b>.</i>
<b>irreverence</b>	A disrespectful act. <i>An attitude of <b>irreverence</b> towards politicians.</i>
<b>ketchup</b>	Thick spicy sauce made from tomatoes.
<b>liquor</b>	An alcoholic beverage that is distilled rather than fermented. <i>Waste <b>liquors</b>.</i>
<b>pertness</b>	Quality of being lively and confident. <i>There was a <b>pertness</b> about her that attracted him.</i>



**presumption**

An inference of the truth of a fact from other facts proved or admitted or judicially noticed.

*He lifted her off the ground and she was enraged at his **presumption**.*

**presumptuousness**

Audacious (even arrogant) behavior that you have no right to.

*He despised them for their **presumptuousness**.*

**relish**

The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth.

*She swigged a mouthful of wine with **relish**.*

**rudeness**

A wild or unrefined state.

*What I will not tolerate is **rudeness**.*

**sauciness**

Inappropriate playfulness.

**shamelessness**

Behavior marked by a bold defiance of the proprieties and lack of shame.

## Associations of "Sauce" (30 Words)

### bake

A social gathering at which baked food of a specified kind is eaten.  
*A vegetable **bake**.*

### boil

With reference to food cook or be cooked by immersing in boiling water or stock.  
***Boil** potatoes.*

### bouillon

A clear seasoned broth.

<b>bread</b>	Coat food with breadcrumbs before cooking. <i><b>Bread</b> the pork chops before frying them.</i>
<b>broth</b>	Liquid in which meat and vegetables are simmered; used as a basis for e.g. soups or sauces. <i>She made a <b>broth</b> from the bones.</i>
<b>chili</b>	Ground beef and chili peppers or chili powder often with tomatoes and kidney beans.
<b>cinnamon</b>	Spice from the dried aromatic bark of the Ceylon cinnamon tree used as rolled strips or ground. <i>He wore a short sleeved shirt and pale <b>cinnamon</b> slacks.</i>
<b>curry</b>	East Indian cookery a pungent dish of vegetables or meats flavored with curry powder and usually eaten with rice. <i>I ve been eating a lot of <b>curry</b>.</i>
<b>ferment</b>	A substance capable of bringing about fermentation. <i>A period of political and religious <b>ferment</b>.</i>
<b>fermentation</b>	The fermentation process involved in the making of beers wines and spirits in which sugars are converted to ethyl alcohol. <i>The <b>fermentation</b> of organic matter by microorganisms in the gut.</i>
<b>flour</b>	Grind grain into flour. <i><b>Flour</b> fish or meat before frying it.</i>
<b>hominy</b>	Hulled corn with the bran and germ removed. <i><b>Hominy</b> grits.</i>
<b>juice</b>	A drink made from fruit or vegetable juice. <i>I know there are 82 players on the <b>juice</b>.</i>
<b>lasagna</b>	Baked dish of layers of lasagna pasta with sauce and cheese and meat or vegetables.
<b>meringue</b>	An item of sweet food made by baking a mixture of stiffly beaten egg whites and sugar until crisp. <i>Cover the pudding with <b>meringue</b>.</i>
<b>noodle</b>	A very thin, long strip of pasta or a similar flour paste, eaten with a sauce or in a soup. <i>Cook the <b>noodles</b> in a large pan of boiling water.</i>
<b>pan</b>	Chimpanzees more closely related to Australopithecus than to other pongids. <i>Heavy spikes can be useful in breaking a surface <b>pan</b> in grassland.</i>
<b>pasta</b>	A dish that contains pasta as its main ingredient.



<b>pie</b>	A baked dish of fruit, or meat and vegetables, typically with a top and base of pastry. <i>A good meal of hot <b>pie</b> and peas.</i>
<b>pizza</b>	Italian open pie made of thin bread dough spread with a spiced mixture of e.g. tomato sauce and cheese. <i>A slice of <b>pizza</b>.</i>
<b>powder</b>	Make into a powder by breaking up or cause to become dust. <i>She dropped a <b>powder</b> into his water glass.</i>
<b>pumpkin</b>	The plant of the gourd family that produces pumpkins having tendrils and large lobed leaves and native to warm regions of America. <i>Listen <b>pumpkin</b> I thought you ought to know.</i>
<a href="#"><u>recipe</u></a>	A set of instructions for preparing a particular dish, including a list of the ingredients required. <i>Sky high interest rates are a <b>recipe</b> for disaster.</i>
<b>saute</b>	A dish of sauteed food. <i><b>Saute</b> the onions.</i>
<b>simmer</b>	A state or temperature just below boiling point. <i>The stew remained at a <b>simmer</b> for hours.</i>
<b>soup</b>	Any composition having a consistency suggestive of soup. <i>We had to <b>soup</b> up the show for the new venue.</i>
<b>spaghetti</b>	An Italian dish consisting largely of spaghetti typically with a sauce.
<a href="#"><u>spicy</u></a>	Producing a burning sensation on the taste nerves. <i><b>Spicy</b> gossip.</i>
<a href="#"><u>starter</u></a>	A contestant in a team sport who is in the game at the beginning. <i>Consumers upgrading from a regular mobile phone to a <b>starter</b> smartphone.</i>
<b>stew</b>	Food prepared by stewing especially meat or fish with vegetables. <i>She s in a right old <b>stew</b>.</i>
