impudent	Marked by casual disrespect. <i>He could have strangled this impudent upstart.</i>
<u>insolent</u>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. <i>She hated the insolent tone of his voice.</i>
<u>irreverent</u>	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>Noisy irreverent tourists.</i>
jaunty	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air- Frances G. Patton- H.M.Reynolds. <i>A jaunty red hat.</i>
out of line	Not worth considering as a possibility.
overbold	Improperly forward or bold. <i>Outlaws from the forests had grown overbold.</i>

pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>She had a pert nose and deep blue eyes.</i>
<u>presumptuous</u>	Excessively forward. <i>The duchess would not put up with presumptuous servants.</i>
raffish	Marked by a carefree unconventionality or disreputableness. <i>A cocktail party given by some raffish bachelors.</i>
rakish	Marked by a carefree unconventionality or disreputableness. <i>He had a rakish debonair look.</i>
ribald	Referring to sexual matters in an amusingly coarse or irreverent way. <i>Ribald language.</i>
risqué	Suggestive of sexual impropriety.
rude	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>A rude coffin.</i>
<u>sassy</u>	Lively, bold, and full of spirit; cheeky. <i>Toni was smart and sassy and liked to pretend she was a hard nut.</i>
shameless	Feeling no shame. <i>A shameless imposter.</i>
smart	Showing impertinence by making clever or sarcastic remarks. <i>We walked at a smart pace.</i>
<u>spicy</u>	Having an agreeably pungent taste. <i>A spicy sauce.</i>
sporty	(of a car) compact and with fast acceleration. <i>The sporty 1 5 litre coupe.</i>
<u>suggestive</u>	Tending to suggest an idea. <i>Suggestive poses.</i>
titillating	Giving sexual pleasure; sexually arousing. <i>She let slip titillating details about her clients.</i>
wise	Aware of, especially so as to know how to act. <i>A wise decision.</i>

<u>gender</u>	Members of a particular gender considered as a group. <i>Social interaction between the genders.</i>
jaunty	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air- Frances G. Patton-H.M.Reynolds. <i>Walked with a jaunty step.</i>
lively	Full of spirit. <i>A lively discussion.</i>
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>No need to be pert miss.</i>
plucky	Having or showing determined courage in the face of difficulties. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
prurient	Having or encouraging an excessive interest in sexual matters, especially the sexual activity of others. <i>Prurient thoughts.</i>
scintillating	Brilliantly and excitingly clever or skilful. <i>The audience loved his scintillating wit.</i>
smart	Having or showing a quick-witted intelligence. <i>Smart weapons.</i>
