<u>austerity</u>	The trait of great self-denial (especially refraining from worldly pleasures). <i>He was noted for his austerity and his authoritarianism.</i>
bank	A building in which the business of banking transacted. <i>A bank of snow.</i>
cheap	At or for a low price. <i>She s too cheap to send me a postcard.</i>
depositor	A person who has deposited money in a bank or similar institution.
economical	Using the minimum of time or resources necessary for effectiveness. <i>An economical shopper.</i>

economy	A particular system or stage of an economy. <i>A free market economy.</i>
frugal	Sparing or economical as regards money or food. <i>A frugal lunch.</i>
frugality	Prudence in avoiding waste. <i>He scorned the finer things in life and valued frugality and simplicity.</i>
meagerly	To a meager degree or in a meager manner. <i>These voices are meagerly represented at the conference.</i>
meanness	Extreme stinginess. <i>The meanness of that existence.</i>
miser	A stingy hoarder of money and possessions often living miserably. <i>A typical miser he hid his money in the house in various places.</i>
niggard	Ungenerous niggardly.
parsimonious	Very unwilling to spend money or use resources. <i>Even the parsimonious Joe paid for drinks all round.</i>
parsimony	Extreme unwillingness to spend money or use resources. <i>A great tradition of public design has been shattered by government parsimony.</i>
<u>recession</u>	The act of becoming more distant. <i>The country is in the depths of a recession.</i>
redemptive	Of or relating to or resulting in redemption. <i>Redemptive or redeeming love.</i>
<u>save</u>	Save from ruin destruction or harm. <i>This approach saves wear and tear on the books.</i>
saving	The activity of protecting something from loss or danger. <i>The agents were cheating them out of their life savings.</i>
schlock	Merchandise that is shoddy or inferior. <i>Mass produced schlock.</i>
scrimp	Be thrifty or parsimonious; economize. <i>Scratch and scrimp.</i>
skimp	Work hastily or carelessly; deal with inadequately and superficially. <i>Don't skimp on insurance when you book your holidays.</i>
sparing	Moderate; economical. <i>Physicians advised sparing use of the ointment.</i>
<u>sparingly</u>	To a meager degree or in a meager manner. <i>The sharply flavoured leaves should be used sparingly.</i>
stinginess	A lack of generosity; a general unwillingness to part with money.

- stingy** Mean; ungenerous.
*His boss is **stingy** and idle.*
- thrift** The quality of using money and other resources carefully and not wastefully.
*The values of **thrift** and self reliance.*
- thriftiness** Frugality in the expenditure of money or resources.
- thrifty** Mindful of the future in spending money.
*He had been brought up to be **thrifty** and careful.*
- tightwad** A mean or miserly person.
*He is a notorious **tightwad**.*
