


- *A person who rescues you from harm or danger.*

christ	Any expected deliverer.
deliverer	A person who rescues you from harm or danger.
good shepherd	That which is pleasing or valuable or useful.
jesus	A teacher and prophet born in Bethlehem and active in Nazareth; his life and sermons form the basis for Christianity (circa 4 BC - AD 29).
jesus christ	Any expected deliverer.
jesus of nazareth	A teacher and prophet born in Bethlehem and active in Nazareth; his life and sermons form the basis for Christianity (circa 4 BC - AD 29).
redeemer	A teacher and prophet born in Bethlehem and active in Nazareth; his life and sermons form the basis for Christianity (circa 4 BC - AD 29).

rescuer	Recovery or preservation from loss or danger. <i>All reached safety and thanked their rescuers.</i>
saviour	A person who rescues you from harm or danger. <i>Politicians of the era usually portray themselves as the nation's saviours.</i>
the nazarene	A teacher and prophet born in Bethlehem and active in Nazareth; his life and sermons form the basis for Christianity (circa 4 BC - AD 29).

angel	In traditional Christian angelology a being of the lowest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy. <i>I miss you too angel.</i>
archangel	A biennial cultivated herb; its stems are candied and eaten and its roots are used medicinally.

archbishop	The chief bishop responsible for a large district. <i>The Archbishop of York.</i>
blessed	Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration. <i>A blessed time.</i>
canonize	Sanction by Church authority. <i>The former president was canonized by the Republican Party.</i>
catholicity	The beliefs and practices of a Catholic Church.
christ	Any expected deliverer.
christendom	The collective body of Christians throughout the world and history (found predominantly in Europe and the Americas and Australia).
<u>christian</u>	Relating to or characteristic of Christianity.
christianity	A monotheistic system of beliefs and practices based on the Old Testament and the teachings of Jesus as embodied in the New Testament and emphasizing the role of Jesus as savior.
<u>church</u>	The body of people who attend or belong to a particular local church. <i>The church was largely rebuilt at the end of the 15th century.</i>
conservancy	The conservation of wildlife and the environment. <i>From the point of view of nature conservancy I d rather see it left unspoilt.</i>
<u>defend</u>	(in sport) protect one's goal or wicket rather than attempt to score against one's opponents. <i>Ms Smith will represent the defendant.</i>
deity	Any supernatural being worshipped as controlling some part of the world or some aspect of life or who is the personification of a force. <i>A deity of ancient Greece.</i>
<u>guardian</u>	A person who protects or defends something. <i>I am acting as guardian of my late brother s family.</i>
hallowed	Worthy of religious veneration. <i>The band will be in some hallowed and historic surroundings.</i>
heaven	The sky, especially perceived as a vault in which the sun, moon, stars, and planets are situated. <i>Those who practised good deeds would receive the reward of a place in heaven.</i>
idolatrous	Relating to or practising idolatry; idol-worshipping. <i>America s idolatrous worship of the auto.</i>

offertory	An anthem accompanying the offertory. <i>They donated the money to a collection which was brought up at the offertory.</i>
orison	A prayer.
<u>parent</u>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Some of the whetstones have been transported up to 400 km from the parent rock.</i>
<u>preserve</u>	A foodstuff made with fruit preserved in sugar such as jam or marmalade. <i>We preserve these archeological findings.</i>
preserver	A substance used to preserve food, wood, or other materials against damage or decay. <i>They are the trusted preservers of law and order and they deserve our respect.</i>
<u>protector</u>	The title of the head of state in England during the later period of the Commonwealth between 1653 and 1659, first Oliver Cromwell (1653-8), then his son Richard (1658-9). <i>A man who became her protector adviser and friend.</i>
rector	The head of certain universities, colleges, and schools.
religion	A pursuit or interest followed with great devotion. <i>The world s great religions.</i>
revere	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>C zanne s still lifes were revered by his contemporaries.</i>
tutelary	Providing protective supervision; watching over or safeguarding. <i>The tutelary spirits of these regions.</i>
<u>worship</u>	The activity of worshipping. <i>They worship in the traditional manner.</i>
