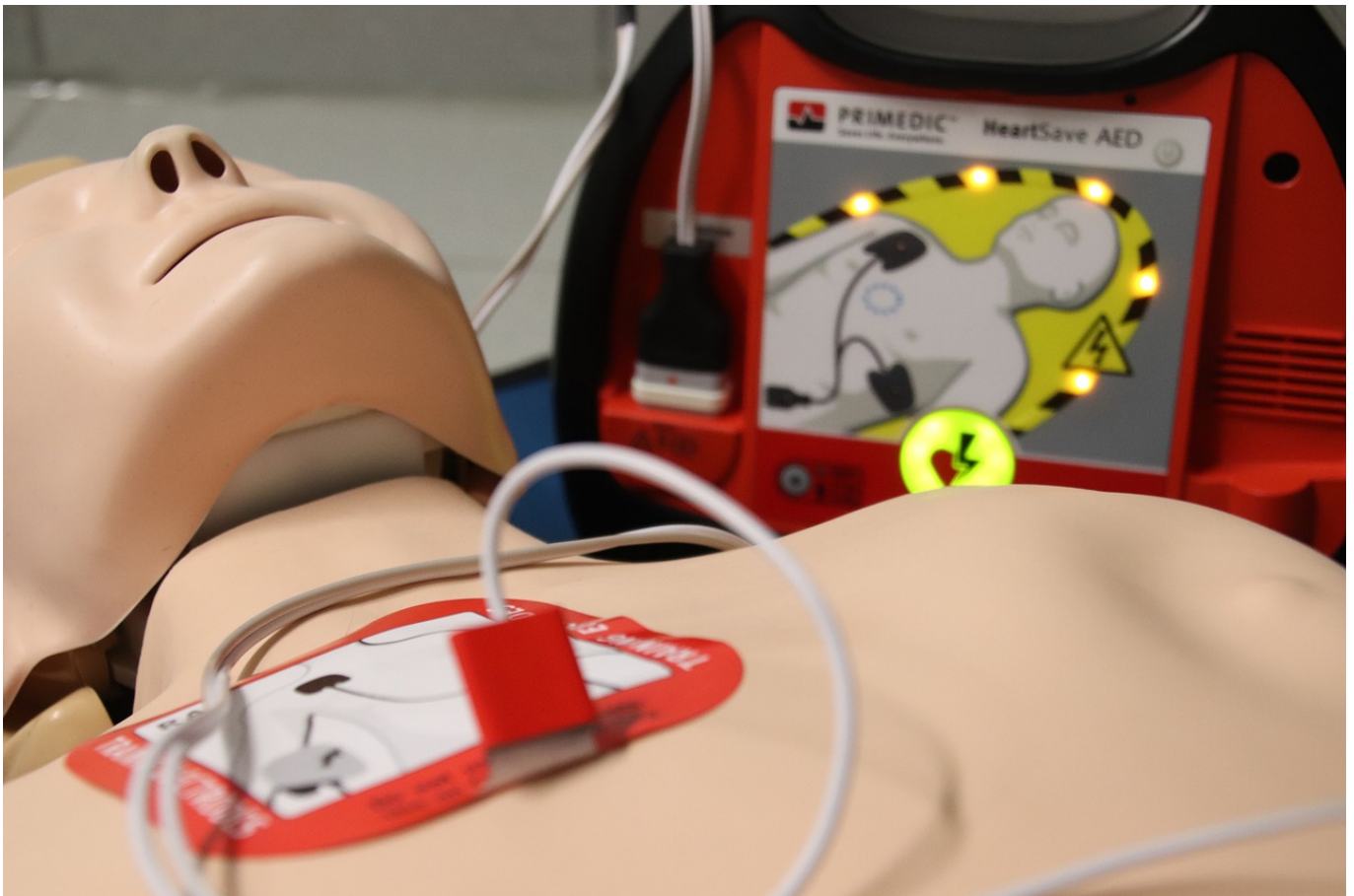
- *A person who rescues you from harm or danger.*

<b>christ</b>	Any expected deliverer.
<b>deliverer</b>	A person who rescues you from harm or danger.
<b>good shepherd</b>	That which is pleasing or valuable or useful.
<b>jesus</b>	A teacher and prophet born in Bethlehem and active in Nazareth; his life and sermons form the basis for Christianity (circa 4 BC - AD 29).
<b>jesus christ</b>	Any expected deliverer.
<b>jesus of nazareth</b>	A teacher and prophet born in Bethlehem and active in Nazareth; his life and sermons form the basis for Christianity (circa 4 BC - AD 29).
<b>redeemer</b>	A teacher and prophet born in Bethlehem and active in Nazareth; his life and sermons form the basis for Christianity (circa 4 BC - AD 29).

- rescuer** Recovery or preservation from loss or danger.  
*All reached safety and thanked their **rescuers**.*
- saviour** A person who rescues you from harm or danger.  
*Politicians of the era usually portray themselves as the nation's **saviours**.*
- the nazarene** A teacher and prophet born in Bethlehem and active in Nazareth; his life and sermons form the basis for Christianity (circa 4 BC - AD 29).



## Associations of "Savior" (30 Words)

- angel** In traditional Christian angelology a being of the lowest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy.  
*I miss you too **angel**.*
- archangel** A biennial cultivated herb; its stems are candied and eaten and its roots are used medicinally.

<b>archbishop</b>	The chief bishop responsible for a large district. <i>The <b>Archbishop</b> of York.</i>
<b>blessed</b>	Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration. <i>A <b>blessed</b> time.</i>
<b>canonize</b>	Sanction by Church authority. <i>The former president was <b>canonized</b> by the Republican Party.</i>
<b>catholicity</b>	The beliefs and practices of a Catholic Church.
<b>christ</b>	Any expected deliverer.
<b>christendom</b>	The collective body of Christians throughout the world and history (found predominantly in Europe and the Americas and Australia).
<b>christian</b>	Relating to or characteristic of Christianity.
<b>christianity</b>	A monotheistic system of beliefs and practices based on the Old Testament and the teachings of Jesus as embodied in the New Testament and emphasizing the role of Jesus as savior.
<b>church</b>	The body of people who attend or belong to a particular local church. <i>The <b>church</b> was largely rebuilt at the end of the 15th century.</i>
<b>conservancy</b>	The conservation of wildlife and the environment. <i>From the point of view of nature <b>conservancy</b> I d rather see it left unspoilt.</i>
<b>defend</b>	(in sport) protect one's goal or wicket rather than attempt to score against one's opponents. <i>Ms Smith will represent the <b>defendant</b>.</i>
<b>deity</b>	Any supernatural being worshipped as controlling some part of the world or some aspect of life or who is the personification of a force. <i>A <b>deity</b> of ancient Greece.</i>
<b>guardian</b>	A person who protects or defends something. <i>I am acting as <b>guardian</b> of my late brother s family.</i>
<b>hallowed</b>	Worthy of religious veneration. <i>The band will be in some <b>hallowed</b> and historic surroundings.</i>
<b>heaven</b>	The sky, especially perceived as a vault in which the sun, moon, stars, and planets are situated. <i>Those who practised good deeds would receive the reward of a place in <b>heaven</b>.</i>
<b>idolatrous</b>	Relating to or practising idolatry; idol-worshipping. <i>America s <b>idolatrous</b> worship of the auto.</i>

<b>offertory</b>	An anthem accompanying the offertory. <i>They donated the money to a collection which was brought up at the <b>offertory</b>.</i>
<b>orison</b>	A prayer.
<b>parent</b>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Some of the whetstones have been transported up to 400 km from the <b>parent</b> rock.</i>
<b>preserve</b>	A foodstuff made with fruit preserved in sugar such as jam or marmalade. <i>We <b>preserve</b> these archeological findings.</i>
<b>preserver</b>	A substance used to preserve food, wood, or other materials against damage or decay. <i>They are the trusted <b>preservers</b> of law and order and they deserve our respect.</i>
<b>protector</b>	The title of the head of state in England during the later period of the Commonwealth between 1653 and 1659, first Oliver Cromwell (1653-8), then his son Richard (1658-9). <i>A man who became her <b>protector</b> adviser and friend.</i>
<b>rector</b>	The head of certain universities, colleges, and schools.
<b>religion</b>	A pursuit or interest followed with great devotion. <i>The world s great <b>religions</b>.</i>
<b>revere</b>	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>C zanne s still lifes were <b>revered</b> by his contemporaries.</i>
<b>tutelary</b>	Providing protective supervision; watching over or safeguarding. <i>The <b>tutelary</b> spirits of these regions.</i>
<b>worship</b>	The activity of worshipping. <i>They <b>worship</b> in the traditional manner.</i>
