bask Revel in and make the most of (something pleasing).
*The seals were **basking** in the sun.*

enjoy Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in.
*The security forces **enjoy** legal immunity from prosecution.*

relish Make pleasant to the taste add relish to.
*I have also a novel to **relish** my wine.*

savour Taste (good food or drink) and enjoy it to the full.
*Gourmets will want to **savour** our game specialities.*

taste Perceive by the sense of taste.
*The ex slave **tasted** freedom shortly before she died.*

delicious	Variety of sweet eating apples. <i>A delicious joke.</i>
edible	Suitable for use as food. <i>Nasturtium seeds are edible.</i>
flavor	Lend flavor to.
flavour	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>The extracts give a flavour of the content and tone of the conversation.</i>
gastronomy	The art and practice of choosing and preparing and eating good food. <i>New England gastronomy.</i>
gustatory	Of or relating to gustation. <i>Gustatory delights.</i>
insipid	Lacking vigour or interest. <i>Mugs of insipid coffee.</i>
liqueur	A chocolate with a liqueur filling. <i>A box of liqueurs.</i>
luscious	Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste. <i>He ll fall for a luscious Spanish girl who can match him in passion.</i>
nip	Sever or remove by pinching or snipping. <i>I m just nipping down to the Post Office.</i>
palatable	(of food or drink) pleasant to taste. <i>A very palatable local red wine.</i>
piquancy	The quality of being pleasantly stimulating or exciting; interest. <i>The tragedy only adds piquancy to the tale.</i>
preference	A thing preferred. <i>Debts owed to the community should be accorded a preference.</i>
saccharine	Relating to or containing sugar; sugary. <i>Saccharine music.</i>
savory	Dwarf aromatic shrub of Mediterranean regions. <i>A past that was scarcely savory.</i>
savour	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>The subtle savour of wood smoke.</i>

<u>sensuous</u>	Attractive or gratifying physically, especially sexually. <i>Her voice was rather deep but very sensuous.</i>
<u>sour</u>	Make or become sour. <i>A false or sour note.</i>
<u>sweet</u>	A small shaped piece of sweet food made with sugar. <i>A sweet shop.</i>
tang	The taste experience when a savoury condiment is taken into the mouth. <i>His words came out with a distinct tang of broad Lancashire.</i>
tangy	Having a strong, piquant flavour or smell. <i>A tangy salad.</i>
taste	The sensation that results when taste buds in the tongue and throat convey information about the chemical composition of a soluble stimulus. <i>The team has not yet tasted victory at home.</i>
<u>tasty</u>	(of food) having a pleasant, distinct flavour. <i>A tasty morsel.</i>
zesty	Marked by spirited enjoyment.
