**enjoy** Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in.

**relish** Make pleasant to the taste add relish to.  
*I have also a novel to **relish** my wine.*

**savour** Taste (good food or drink) and enjoy it to the full.

*The ex slave **tasted** freedom shortly before she died.*
